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
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Editorial

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



SALUTE TO THOSE WHO SERVE

NCNC Honors Nepalese in the US Military

We can't put a timestamp on when exactly people of Nepalese origin started to join the United States military, but the history dates to few decades back. Likewise, we don't have official number on how many Nepalese are in the US military, but the estimates show a number north of 2,000; out of 65,000 immigrants (non-U.S. citizens and naturalized citizens) serving in the US military as of February 2018. The US military consists of five armed service branches: Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, and Navy. The US military offers more than 150 different career paths. As an active duty soldier, one can choose from jobs in art, science, intelligence, combat, aviation, engineering, law and more. Generally, to join the U.S. military, non-citizens must be living permanently and legally in the United States. Non-citizens must also have permission to work in the United States, possess an I-551

(Permanent Residence Card), have obtained a high school diploma and speak English. However, not a military secret per se, MAVNI (Military Accessions Vital to the National Interest) is a small and very exclusive program that benefits immigrants. The MAVNI is a special recruiting program that has been available to certain immigrants interested in joining the U.S. military. The program allows certain non-citizens in the United States to join the military and thereby gain eligibility for U.S. citizenship without first having to go through the lengthy process of obtaining a green card. Generally, MAVNI program applicants must be in a legal immigration status. Legal status means that applicants must be asylees, refugees, recipients of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) or hold any of the following nonimmigrant visas: E, F, H, I, J, K, L, M, O, P, Q, R, S, T, TC, TD, TN, U or V.

Sgt. Saral Shrestha, US Armies Soldier of the Year

The US Armies Soldier of the Year in 2012, Sgt. Saral K Shrestha, who was born and raised in Kathmandu, traveled to the US on a student visa before becoming a US citizen through the MAVNI program. He came to the United States when he was 17, joined the Army at age 21. Shrestha, a power generation equipment repairer, was assigned to Group Service Support Co., Group Support Bn., 3rd Special Forces Group, U.S. Army Special Forces Command, Fort Bragg, N.C. He has served for three years in the Army and has completed a deployment

to Afghanistan. He has a Bachelor's Degree in computer information science and wants to earn a Master's Degree in computer engineering and become an Army officer. Though Shrestha wished to serve in the U.S. military, he initially had no avenue to join without U.S. citizenship or permanent residence. That changed in 2009 when the Department of Defense introduced the MAVNI program. "MAVNI was a blessing," Shrestha said. "When I graduated my basic training, I had one of the come onto the field with a United States flag and I took my oath." Shrestha considers it the most special day of his life. "I realized I was part of something way bigger," he said.

Interview: Sakar Basnet



Please describe in brief about your time in US Armed Force? Which US Armed Force branch did you join – Army, Navy, Airforce, Marine Corps or Coast Guards? How old were you when you joined?

I signed my contract with the U.S. Army when I was 17 years old. I went to basic

training after I graduated high school and spent the last 4 years in Georgia, California, and South Korea.

Why did you decide to join the US Armed Force? I decided to join the U.S. Army primarily for two reasons – I wanted to have my college education paid for using the GI bill and I needed time to develop and explore interests that I'd like to pursue in college.

Why did you pick the particular wing (Army, Air Force etc...) of the US military over the others? In my opinion, the Army provides the most opportunities and freedom for personal development. Unlike the other branches, I could choose the specific job I wanted to pursue based on my interests. Plus, I'm not the biggest fan of water or heights so my decision was quite simple.

Did you consult with family/friends before deciding to join? What was their reaction?

Yes, I sought advice from family and friends throughout my entire decision-making process. Luckily, I knew several veterans who candidly shared their experiences with me. I was also extremely lucky to have so much support from not just my family but the entire Nepalese community. My family has been extremely proud.

What was the process of joining US Armed Force? What qualifications one needs to have? The process of joining the Army is simpler than one might think. I talked to a recruiter who helped me through the entire process. I took an exam, the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB), which helped determine the type of jobs available to me in the Army based on my score. I chose my MOS, Military Occupational Specialty, and signed my contract shortly after. There are no specific qualifications you need as long as you meet the Army's physical requirements.

Where are you stationed, and what is your military occupational specialty (MOS)?

I spent a year in Georgia for training. My first duty station was Camp Roberts, California where I spent two years. For my final year, I was stationed in Camp Red Cloud, South Korea. My MOS was 25N, Nodal Network Systems Operator-Maintainer. My primary responsibility was to ensure that those out in the field had secure internet and voice capabilities. Have you ever been deployed? If so, when and where? Please describe the experience in some details

I was never deployed to a combat-zone. What are job opportunities available within the US military?

As long as you score well on the ASVAB, there are thousands of job opportunities available to you. For example, you can be a nurse, a mechanic, an IT Specialist, a firefighter, and even a scuba diver. I was surprised to find so many options within the Army.

In your opinion, what are the advantages of joining the US military? And what are the disadvantages? There are many advantages of joining the military such as having the opportunity to travel, developing vourself, and meeting extraordinary people. I never thought I would have the chance to live in California or South Korea by myself. I gained valuable work experience right out of high school. Throughout the years, I made friendships that will last a lifetime and met inspiring leaders whose lessons will continue to influence me. I also want to mention the great benefits such as free medical care and having food/lodging paid for. In my opinion, the biggest disadvantage is your lack of control. I've been very fortunate to be stationed in great locations under great leadership but others are not always that lucky. You cannot choose when or where you will be stationed, who or how your unit/leadership will be. A bad station, unit, or leadership can be deflating to morale and drive soldiers to end their contracts early.

How long did you serve, if you have already quit? And why?

I served for 4 years. I left the Army because I knew it was time for me to pursue my college education. I may re-enlist after college, but who knows? Do you know where are you going next? Yes, I will be attending The University of North Carolina at Wilmington in the fall where I will be pursuing a degree in Computer Science. Do you wonder if you will fit in when you are back to civil life?

Honestly, it was never a big concern of mine. All my units were very relaxed so I never conformed to the strict army culture. I am certainly looking forward to being able to sleep-in though! Do you think you have better life skills now after joining the military? Please describe those skills. Absolutely. Professionally, I had a chance to develop my leadership and communication skills. I was fortunate to have exemplary NCOs, Non-Commissioned Offers or Sergeants, who gave me the opportunity and confidence to lead teams, motivate peers, and drive results. On a personal level, I lived far away from my family therefore I learned how to manage a home, be financially independent, and most importantly, cook a great Nepalese meal.

What do you think is the best thing you have learned during your military life?

The best and the most important thing I learned in the military is that nothing lasts forever. You might be on the last 3 miles of a 12-mile march in the middle of summer with full uniform or you might be spending 4 marvelous days backpacking solo in Cambodia. Either way, things come to an end. Whether you're going through a challenging time or having the time of your life, it's important to be

able to identify moments where you need to focus on the end goal versus being more present. If you're going through a difficult time, know that it will end. If you're having a great time, be present and enjoy it because it, too, will end.

What suggestions do you have for Nepalese youngsters aspiring to join the military? I know a lot of times we Nepalese kids get pressured into doing what someone else's kid is doing. I suggest you do some soul-searching to determine if joining the army is what you truly want. It's a big commitment and you won't last if it's not what you wanted in the first place. Secondly, include your parents through the entire process. Joining the military not only affects your life but your family's as well and it will be extremely difficult to make it through if you don't have their support. What are your suggestions to those who want to pursue military career entire life?

Like all things in life, you get what you put in. If after a few years, you enjoy the military life, then go for it. For me, I knew wanted to go back to school and explore other opportunities.



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Interview: Ananda Ghimire



Mr. Ananda Ghimire was born in Gorkha, Nepal in 1986. He stayed there till he turned 13 before moving to Nawalparasi to complete high school education. He came to the US in 2005 under the Diversity Visa lottery program. He received bachelor's degree from North Carolina Central University in 2015 and

currently works as research scientist at a biotech

company in Durham, NC.

Please describe in brief about your time in US Armed Force? Which US Armed Force branch did you join – Army, Navy, Airforce, Marine Corps or Coast Guards? How old where you when you joined? I joined the United States Army on November 2008 at the age of 22. It was the greatest experience of

my lifetime.

Why did you decide to join the US Armed Force? I was looking for a way to give back to the community and country, which took me in as one of its resident. Serving in the US armed force was a way to fulfill my wish. It was a great opportunity to learn about American culture and adjust to American lifestyle. Why did you pick the particular wing (Army, Airforce etc...) of the US military over the others? Two recruiters from the US army approached me and explained the benefits of joining the Army reserve. They explained how I can serve the country I live in, make living, and get paid for the college education at the same time. I knew it then I made a right decision to join army reserve.

Did you consult with family/friends before deciding

to join? What was their reaction?

I did talk to my family about my interest in joining the US army. At first, my family was not happy with my decision but after explaining the risk and benefits of serving, my family supported me.

What was the process of joining US Armed Force? What qualifications one needs to have? The process of joining US armed begins when you contact the recruiter showing the interest to join.

Candidate can also contact the recruiter through online. Candidate can decide which branch of armed force to join if he/she can pass the required qualification. When a candidate meets with recruiter, recruiter will explain the benefits of joining and qualifications required. The qualifications to join the services keep changing as the need of new service member in the force. When I joined the service, there was a great demand of volunteers to join the team, so the army was offering different sign on bonus programs of various amounts depending on the job. The recruiter will explain what jobs are available within the branch and requirements for the job; if the candidate likes the job, the sign in process begins with evaluation of physical fitness and education level.

Where are you stationed, and what is your military

occupational specialty (MOS)?

My first duty station was in Cary NC. My MOS was 92A (Automated logistics specialist). The duty of 92A was to work in logistics and supply in the assigned unit. 92 A orders, maintains and distributes all the items/equipment required to operate a military unit.

Have you ever been deployed? If so, when and where? Please describe the experience in some details


I served in operation enduring freedom, and was deployed to Afghanistan for a 10-month term in 2011-2012. Each deployment has its own challenges, even though it was a tough mission, I enjoyed the company of my Nepalese brothers who came to work in Afghanistan and worked in United nation military base.

What are job opportunities available within the US

military?

There are many job opportunities available within the US military, each jobs comes with its own risk and benefits. Contacting recruiter is the best way to find out what jobs are available and where they are. Recruiters are available in most cities throughout the US.

In your opinion, what are the advantages of joining the US military? And what are the disadvantages? I believe joining military has more advantages than disadvantages. Advantages includes good paying



job, upmost respect from community and government, fast path to citizenship (for non-citizen service members), great benefits, opportunity to travel the world in uncle Sam's expense, free education. You become veteran and are able to get veteran's benefit.

As any other jobs military, also have some challenges. You must be physically fit and ready to move around as soon as the orders comes, sometimes in couple days of notice.

How long did you serve, if you have already quit?

And whv?

I served during the period of my contract, which was 8 years in US Army Reserve. In that time, I had to report to the assigned unit one weekend a month for the first 6 years (excluding the time I was deployed). Last 2 year I was inactive (no need to report to the unit but be ready to go active if the order arrives). I got my honorable discharge at the end of 8-year contract. I did not sign another contract because I wanted to stay in North Carolina and change my field to Biotech industry. Do you know where are you going next? Since I am no longer in the force, I will not be going anywhere. However, for the people who are in service, they will get move around the world as needed.

Do you wonder if you will fit in when you are back to civil life?

Adjusting to civil life right after active duty is a challenge but there are plenty of help available to

help service member transition to civilian life. We should not hesitate to seek help if needed. Do you think you have better life skills now after joining the military? Please describe those skills. Service members learn great sets of hard skills and soft skills from military. Hard skills are based on the job he/she performs within military and are different per service members. Soft skills, applies to all, are army core values LDRSHIP (Loyalty, Duty, Respect, Selfless Service, Honor, Integrity, and Personal Courage).

What do you think is the best thing you have learned

during your military life?

The army core values are the best things I have learned from my service and I do think those values


has enhanced my live in positive way.

What suggestions do you have for Nepalese youngsters aspiring to join the military? My suggestion to Nepalese youngsters is that it is a pride to serve your country. I would suggest joining early so that you have your retirement/pension very early, and have enough time to travel the world and enjoy the life.

What are your suggestions to those who want to

pursue military career entire life?

Join early and fulfill all the minimum requirements to get promotions as soon as possible. As you climb up the rank, you will make more money and make more impact to the unit and world.

Mr. SanojShakya was born in Kathmandu, Nepal in 1979. He moved to the US in 2004 and currently working as Med Tech in Durham VA medical center.

Please describe in brief about your time in US Armed Force? Which US Armed Force branch did you join – Army, Navy, Airforce, Marine

Corps or Coast Guards? How old where you when you joined?

During operation Iraqi freedom, United States Marine Corps 2004-2008, at age 24.

Why did you decide to join the US Armed Force? Always wanted to join the Nepalese Army; unfortunately, didn't get an opportunity, but didn't want to miss this one.

Why did you pick the particular wing (Army, Airforce etc...) of the US military over the others? *Wanted to join, so thought why not join the best.* Did you consult with family/friends before deciding to join? What was their reaction?

Didn't not consult with anyone, they were shocked when I told them.

What was the process of joining US Armed Force? What qualifications one needs to have? If you go see a recruiter they take care of all the processes, but you must pass the aptitude test (ASVAP). Based on the score you get they will provide you with various option of work field. At the time you had to be a Green card holder, anywhere between 17-32, and must have high school diploma. Where are you stationed, and what is your military occupational specialty (MOS)?



Please describe in brief about your time in US Armed Force? Which US Armed Force branch did you join – Army, Navy, Airforce, Marine Corps or Coast Guards? How old where you when you joined? So far I have been in the military for going on 3 years. I joined the Navy when I was around my

mid 20s. Initially starting my DEP (Delayed Entry Program) when I was 19. My DEP process took about a year before I took further initiative to actually going to boot camp. I ended up being processed in early sept of 2015.

Why did you decide to join the US Armed Force? I initially went to college after high school with the intentions of pursuing a degree but I wasn't sure exactly what I wanted to do. Honestly, I didn't put a good foot forward going into it and realized the lack of effort and motivation I had towards my classes. Realizing how much times I was wasting I decided to pursue more information on different outlets towards gaining job experience while having an opportunity for schooling. The military showed ample promise for what I was looking for; although, I was hesitant so I decided to do more independent research on the matter. *Ultimately I ended up joining because of the heavily* boasted OJT aspect of the military. For me, I am a hands on learner so I thought this would cater heavily to me while assisting me advancing my career goals and potentially assisting me in choosing a path. Also being paid to work towards a career as someone just coming out of high school it definitely swayed my decision. As well as the Free incentives obviously different for each branch.

Why did you pick the particular wing (Army, Airforce etc...) of the US military over the others? I Don't care for infantry or the potential of being on the front lines. No disrespect for the many that man those positions but my intentions of joining the military were to get as much as I could out of it so ARMY and the MARINES were crossed off my list. Besides in my eves those branches didn't seem very beneficial to what I was pursuing or what I was looking for (again no offense to those that serve). When I went to the recruiting offices the AIRFORCE recruiters seemed to always be absent so I reverted my attention to the NAVY recruiters. I've had conversations with prior members of the NAVY so you could say I was influenced a little bit. But regardless, I liked the freedom and ability to travel that is unrivaled by any other branch. Did you consult with family/friends before deciding to join? What was their reaction?

My parents were a little uneasy about it at first but I assume it was because of the potential of me being in dangerous situations as well as being so far away from home. But eventually they got around to the idea and I had their full support.

What was the process of joining US Armed Force? What qualifications one needs to have?

Someone as young as 17 can join the military. Qualifications vary but for the most part you can get waivers for anything. Joining is easy just visit a local recruiting office to get further details. But word of warning don't rush anything and research thoroughly before committing to a decision. This is a life changing step in your future. Understand that joining is normally a minimum of 4 years and that's under contract. Where are you stationed, and what is your military occupational specialty (MOS)?

I've been stationed in several places first beginning with Great Lakes, IL for boot camp. Afterwards, I was sent to school for my original rate/MOS of A-PACT (or Aviation Undesignated) in Pensacola, FL. Following aviation school I was given my first permanent duty station being in Whidbey Island, WA where I made my home for the next year along with the rest of my squadron VAQ 137. During the year I spent with VAQ 137 I had the opportunity to travel to many different places. But being that I was undesignated I didn't necessarily have a job. I fell under a general status but my main priority was being a plane captain and assisting in the daily maintenance and upkeep of 5 electronic attack Fighter jets. I launched jets several times a day till a year in I was up for picking a specified rate/mos. I opted out the first time because I didn't get what I wanted offered to me aside from one job which was HM, otherwise known as, Hospital Corpsman. I decided to take a chance at it and put in to get the rate/mos. I was accepted and I was on my way out of Washington to complete school for my new rate/mos, HM. School was held in San Antonio, TX. I settled there for about 2 and a half months till I got the opportunity to choose where I go next; where is where I am currently stationed. San Diego, CA is now my new home till about August 2020. I now work at a hospital assisting with emergency medical care in the ER (Emergency room) of BALBOA hospital or Naval Medical Center San Diego. Overseeing and assisting in the care of over 200+ patients a day. My specific job title allows me the freedom to learn various different procedures and apply my knowledge to get hands on training. I've been involved in many awesome experiences and I'm confident to say that I have more knowledge and experience than any nursing student

Have you ever been deployed? If so, when and where? Please describe the experience in some details *I have not had the opportunity to deploy. Although,*

during my time in aviation I had the chance to partake in plenty of dets (detachments). These detachments involved us going through simulated drills with other partner squadrons or branches allowing us to travel and work for a brief period of time. Some of the places I've gone include: Fairbanks, AL; Shreveport, LA; Key West, FL.

What are job opportunities available within the US military?

There is a huge variety of job opportunities as I indicated before I went from working on 100 million dollar fighter jets to working in an Emergency Room on live patients. There's plenty of opportunities, for example, me being undesignated first gave me the chance to feel out what kind of job I wanted and where I would fit in at first I was skeptical about my recent pick up on the HM job but it turned out to be pretty dope.

In your opinion, what are the advantages of joining the US military? And what are the disadvantages? Advantages: For me I got the opportunity to see places I wouldn't have otherwise seen myself. As well as that, I got to meet some amazing people. In a sense I had family away from home. Another thing is I would've been stuck trying to figure out what I wanted to do or just stuck in a hamster wheel. College is a great avenue for everyone and although I opted for the military instead of college I've studied way harder than I ever have for the military but the difference is I didn't have to waste thousands of dollars changing my major or anything I was put in a field tried it out and found a field I enjoy. Plus consistent pay, every 1st and 15th. Disadvantages: You do have some of your freedom taken from you. There are restrictions, it's not like how it was as a "civilian" you have to be careful of how you behave and where you are. Consequences come so much easier than reward and you just have to practice caution considering it's the US military, members are held to a high standard. At home there's not a huge threat to getting in trouble more often than not it's a slap on the wrist. Same with work (civilian side) you might get fired at worst but with the military vou are under contract to stay in so worst comes to worst there are ways that swift punishment is dealt as unfair as it seems the military has these regulations to keep members in check and prevent unfortunate situations from happening. You have to learn to roll

with the punches. But my biggest disadvantage I've seen being in the military is... Being so far away from home. I miss it every day. Being on the other side of the country is tough, hardly getting a month out of the year to see them is rough but you have to adjust. How long did you serve, if you have already quit? And why?

Continuing to serve now and I am on my 3rd year going till at least 2020.

Do you know where are you going next? Depends on if I reenlist. We pick orders a year out from our PRD (projected rotation date). Do you wonder if you will fit in when you are back to civil life?

Nope I'm confident I can adjust to it. Although it will take some getting used to.

Do you think you have better life skills now after joining the military? Please describe those skills. Definitely! Being independent, for one, has given me a better sense of maturing and living on my own. I don't have to pay rent but I am more conscious of my bills and planning ahead to ensure they are paid. I'm more proactive overall and I have better understanding of finances.

What do you think is the best thing you have learned during your military life?

Think before you sign. And don't sweat the little stuff. Things are so easy in the military it's laughable. Always have a positive outlook.... Trust me things will be much easier if you do.

What suggestions do you have for Nepalese youngsters aspiring to join the military?

Make sure you understand what you are getting into! It's hard to say everything but, anyone with further questions on the matter or just want to know what it's like! My line is open. Ask me anything I'm more than willing to help as much as I can to help you make a decision.

What are your suggestions to those who want to pursue military career entire life?

The military isn't a way to avoid schooling... believe me. In fact, I study more than I ever thought I would. I promise you if there's anything that will help you advance, it's studying. And Evals but mostly study your job extensively. And plan like you'll get a degree while in.

Interview: Dinesh Lama



Mr. Dinesh Lama came to the US in 2007 under the Diversity Visa program. He earned bachelor's degree in environmental science in Nepal.

Namaskar Everyone, my name is Dinesh Lama. All of the answers I have provided below are just my personal opinion

about US military profession. Please do not take it as an official answer from any organization. Please describe in brief about your time in US Armed Force? Which US Armed Force branch did you join – Army, Navy, Airforce, Marine Corps or Coast Guards? How old where you when you joined? I served US Army June, 2008 to July 2015. I was 27 years old when I joined US Army.

Why did you decide to join the US Armed Force? Initially I was driven by our Gurkha culture and for Adventure. But later on I realized it is a very honorable profession, and also helps to build strong foundation for your career in any field. Why did you pick the particular wing (Army, Airforce etc...) of the US military over the others? Like I said earlier, I was more driven by Gurkha culture, there is no navy and air force in Nepal, hence I was simply not attracted to them. However later on I realized that all branches are equally respectful with similar benefits.

Did you consult with family/friends before deciding to join? What was their reaction?

Yes, I did talk to Nepalese but most of them didn't know much about it. They had misperception that you must be strong like a horse, pay is very minimum, must be very young, job is very rough, you must move from places to places all the time, you won't get chance to live with your family. Basically they tried to portrait that one joins us military when he or she is out of option in life.

I must say all of the above perceptions are myth. Pay is actually very good. Your military W-2 form will only show your basic salary which makes it look so little, however you get nontaxable big bucks every month as a house allowance, food allowance, and etc which makes your net income much better than average jobs. In addition to that Military pays for your education, gives best health insurance in free, pays for clothing, gives you pension (if you

serve long enough), and many more.

One must be physically fit to live happy life even when you are a civilian. Good Fitness is necessary in military but you do not have to be Olympian type of fit to join military. It is very organized professional field, you will have excellent resources and support system to do your job. Usually military people work in one station for 3 years inside the USA and for 6-12 months in risky overseas areas. If you are married, you move to those areas with your spouse and kids unless it is a very risky area. All my friends have lived in all over the Europe, Japan, Korea, with their spouse and family.

What was the process of joining US Armed Force? What qualifications one needs to have? You simply type US army/navy/air-force recruiter in google, it will give you recruiters location and website, and you call them, get appointment, and meet them. Recruiters are facilitators, they will help you to join. You do not need to know in detail about joining process, recruiter will walk you through the process. In order to join as an officer, you generally must have a bachelor degree. If you are planning to join as a medical doctor or any other professional, you must have a respective degree on that field. To join as an enlisted members, high school diploma is sufficient however having few college credits (15-30 credits) makes your application package stronger. Where are you stationed, and what is your military

I worked for 2290th US Army Hospital which was located in D.C. Metro area. My MOS was 68Q which is a pharmacy specialist. Army gave me extensive training to do this job.

occupational specialty (MOS)?

Have you ever been deployed? If so, when and where? Please describe the experience in some details.

Unfortunately I was never deployed, perhaps being a pharmacy personnel, my hands were full of work here.

What are job opportunities available within the US military?

US Military has all the jobs available just like in civilian sectors. You can be a medical doctor, nurse, pilot, engineer, IT personnel, lawyer, chaplain, all kinds of medical technicians, cook, driver, infantry man, administrative clerks, environmentalist, chemist, mathematician, microbiologist, etc. In your opinion, what are the advantages of joining the US military? And what are the disadvantages? The positive side of joining US military is that it gives you sense of pride, disciplined lifestyle, and solid foundation for building your career further.

Majority of Americans will see you very positively and will show gratitude towards you for serving the nation. Military always trains its member certain job skills which match to civilian sector, so usually you will not have issues finding job afterward. Prior Military service member often gets priority in hiring events by other government agencies and civilian sectors. It pays for your school. You can take classes while you are in the military and also when you are out of the military. Many soldiers get out of military, go for school while being paid, and either join back or start something new. I am a diehard fan of US Military, hence I do not see any disadvantages. I guess if you are a person who doesn't like to exercise, doesn't want to study, doesn't like to wake up early in the morning, and doesn't like to live organized disciplined life, Military lifestyle can be challenging.

How long did you serve, if you have already quit? And why?

I served for 7 years. I got out to watch my two very little kids and to finish up my bachelor in nursing program while my wife was working full time. US army paid for my school, and also paid me monthly allowance while I was in the school (even when I was out of military) under GI Bill. With all that amazing financial help, today I am a Registered Nurse with Bachelor degree in nursing. Do you know where are you going next? Currently I am working as a Registered Nurse in INOVA Alexandria Hospital, and am applying to join back military as a nurse officer. Hopefully by the grace of god, I will be working as a nurse officer in military soon, otherwise will continue to improve myself as a clinical nurse in civilian sector. Do you wonder if you will fit in when you are back to civil life?




"Taking care of people like your own family member" gives you the greatest satisfaction and also the best key to win the heart of others. US Military fosters that culture which is the best thing I learned from it.

Please describe in brief about your time in US Armed Force? Which US Armed Force branch did you join – Army, Navy, Airforce, Marine Corps or Coast Guards? How old where you when you joined?

I joined United States Marine Corps at age 23.

Why did you decide to join

the US Armed Force?

I had wanted to join and serve for at least 4 years for some time. I decided to take a break from college and join.

Why did you pick the particular wing (Army, Airforce etc...) of the US military over the others? The Marines have a reputation for excellence; it made sense for me to join the branch that demands the most from an individual.

Did you consult with family/friends before deciding to join? What was their reaction?

I told my parents that I wanted to join. My mom was not very happy.

What was the process of joining US Armed Force? What qualifications one needs to have? The Marines have initial physical fitness requirements of 2 pull-ups, 35 sit-ups in 2 minutes, and 1.5 mile run in 13:30 minutes. Besides that, each branch has specific requirements for the ASVAB test. The results from that test determine which MOS' a service member is qualified for. Certain jobs also require a security clearance. Where are you stationed, and what is your military occupational specialty (MOS)?

I was stationed in Camp Lejeune, NC as part of the 2^{nd} Marine Division. I was an infantry rifleman, 0311.

Have you ever been deployed? If so, when and where? Please describe the experience in some details.

I deployed with 2nd Battalion 9th Marines to Okinawa, Philippines, and South Korea. I deployed with 1st Battalion 8th Marines as a detachment in the Combined Arms Company to Bulgaria, Romania, and Norway.


What are job opportunities available within the US military?

As stated above, ASVAB test score and security clearance will restrict occupations. If you cannot pass the training course for the occupation you were assigned, then they will reassign you to something else. Opportunities range from administrative clerks, aircraft crew, artillery, cooks, drivers, infantrymen, mechanics, supply specialists, etc. Some jobs, which the Marines call 'B Billets' require the Marine to have reached a certain rank and have spent a certain amount of time in the branch. These jobs, such as drill instructor, recruiter, Marine Special Operator, etc. are in high demand but also have high demands on the individual. As such, these schools often have a high failure rate. Some jobs, such as pilots, are reserved for commissioned officers.

In your opinion, what are the advantages of joining the US military? And what are the disadvantages? The military offers benefits such as free tuition as well as professional certifications in many jobs (such as aviation mechanic or paralegal). In addition to personality and physical development, the military also puts individuals in high stress leadership positions. This can be beneficial to people returning from the military and joining the workforce.

How long did you serve, if you have already quit? And why?

I served 4 years of active duty, which was the required portion of my contract. There is a lot of nonsense that happens in the military, which leads



to many people not re-enlisting. For me, the Marines had taught me what I wanted to learn, and the friends that I had made during my 4 years of service were leaving as well.

Do you know where are you going next?

I am on track to earn a baccalaureate in Management Information Systems, and will enter the professional field after graduation. Do you wonder if you will fit in when you are back to civil life?

No.

Do you think you have better life skills now after joining the military? Please describe those skills. As stated above, I have some leadership experience and have often interacted with people whose viewpoints are different from mine. This gives me a unique perspective on problems, and helps mediate issues in the workplace or community. Besides that, the usual things such as discipline, timeliness, etc. What do you think is the best thing you have learned during your military life?





They will give you all the training you need, you will get experience during your period of service, and you can start working right away after your required service is finished.

If you want to go to college after the military, then start taking some classes while you are still serving. This will help you develop, and maintain, study habits as well as show colleges that you are serious about earning a degree when you apply for admission.

Save your money, don't get married in your first 4 years of service, and pick your friends wisely. What are your suggestions to those who want to pursue military career entire life?

Earn a college degree, and seek to join the military as a commissioned officer. Commissioned officers have more respect, better pay, and have better prospects after their career is finished. Some branches have ROTC programs on university campuses, research ROTC scholarships. They will pay for your college tuition, in return for obligated service after you graduate.

While traveling to Nepal for a vacation, Manita was encouraged by friends to apply for Miss Nepal. Taking their advice, she went to the auditions, and the rest is history! Below is an interview with Miss Universe Nepal, Manita Devkota, where she talks about the journey of her life, her experience of getting honored with one of the most esteemed crowns in Nepal, her ambitions, and more.

1. As a child, had you ever thought that you would be participating in such a contest and win the title of Miss Nepal?

No, as a child I didn't know about Miss Nepal or what a beauty pageant was. During my childhood, I remember huddling by the TV with my sisters watching Miss USA and Miss America, and being completely mesmerized by all the ladies. It wasn't until my teenage year I realized the concept of a

beauty pageant.

As I got older, few of my friends started to encourage me to compete in Miss Nepal USA. Unfortunately, the pageant was discontinued. In 2014, I was approached to try for Miss Nepal so I started researching the pageant more. I was warming up to the idea of trying for Miss Nepal because I had always intended to go back to Nepal after establishing myself as a professional here in America. I realized that if I became a Miss Nepal, I would have a chance to develop respectable professional or social contacts. People would be willing to work and invest on projects affiliated with a Miss Nepal. By my late teens, I became more interested to compete, however, because of school it hadn't been possible. I thought

Miss Nepal was going to be a goal that I wouldn't be able to tick off, until this year.

2. Tell us a little bit about yourself. Where did you complete your education? Did you have a modeling career before you began training for Miss Nepal? If so, how did this modelling career begin? I'm a down-to-earth individual who has a lot of goals and aspirations in life. I want to travel the world and try all the world's cuisines. I want to write a book and give a Ted Talk and so much more. Fun fact, I turned 23 on the day of the Miss Nepal 2018 finale and the Miss Nepal Universe crown

has been the best birthday gift I have ever received. I have a Bachelor's degree from East Carolina University in Public Health with a concentration on Pre-Health Professions. I chose this major because improving the lives of people, especially women and children, is something I care about. I hope to work with UNICEF one day and promote health

and wellness in developing countries.

Something I'm proud of is my involvement with the organization Days for Girls (DfGs) and She's the First. Both of these are non-profit organizations with a mission to empower girls by promoting girls' education and health. During my three years involvement with She's the First, we fundraised money to sponsor four girls' education in Kopila Valley School in Birendranagar, Surkhet, Nepal. My involvement with Days for Girls, continues till today, I am affiliated with Nepal's chapter of DfGs. In many areas of Nepal, girls don't have access to sanitation facilities and menstrual items, and after they've reached puberty they end up skipping school or dropping out. We want to keep these susceptible girls in school and educate them on menstrual hygiene and reproductive health. DfGs don't just provide dignity and health education to Nepalese girls and women, it also provides employment opportunities.

I had no prior modeling experience when joining Miss Nepal. In fact, this year's all four Miss Nepals don't come from a modeling background. We were just ordinary girls. Since becoming a Miss Nepal, I've been learning and taking pointers on modeling.

3. When did you decide you wanted to take part in Miss Nepal, and what made you decide? I'm always open to trying new things, especially if

it helps to improve me. For a few years, I was interested to compete but never could because I was living in US and Nepal was on the other side of the world. Luckily this year, I decided to go for a gap year to travel and explore India and Nepal. It was serendipity, this year I ended up in Nepal just at the right moment.

I met the requirements for a contestant and it was the perfect time because I wasn't in school and I wasn't working. I told myself "why not?" and went for it. With a little bit of Universe's blessing and some hard work I managed to win a title. 4. What was the process to the title like? One of the toughest part of the competition was just getting situated and adjusted to living in a "foreign land". Obviously sweet North Carolina and KTM are two contrasting environments and having been brought up in NC made adjusting to KTM a bit difficult. I would also get sick often so I had to get used to the air and noise pollution. Another challenge was my weight. I was traveling in India beginning of this year, while in India I went on countless foodventures and had gained some unwanted weight. I had to lose weight for the competition. I manage to lose 14 lbs during the course of the 7 weeks training.

Thoughts of giving up and just going back to US did appear in my mind. However, I persevered and toughed it out, and I was rewarded. I won and now I have completely adjusted to Nepal and loving every moment of being here. This beauty pageant world is completely new to me so I had to start from the basics. Things like ramp walking, modeling, makeup, and styling aren't my forte, so I had to learn those. Fortunately, I am quick learner, I managed to improve and even win the "Miss Glam" subtitle. During the seven week training, we were given lectures on public speaking, etiquettes, tourism, federalism, and women empowerment. A week before the finale, we have our preliminary rounds where we have one-on-one with the judges. This is where top 14 is decided and the judges get to know you and interview you. The last three days leading to the finale, we go to closed camp at hotel Annapurna, where we rehearse and give our final performance.

5. How long does it take to plan and prepare for the competition?

I did no planning whatsoever. Some of the contestants had been planning for MN for years, i.e., working on their fitness, their walks, and make up skills. It was an impromptu decision because the timing suited my situation. I entered the competition with the mindset that all my life experiences, my skills and knowledge would help me and I will learn along the way. I guess it worked, you need to have faith in yourself and be brave enough to just jump at an opportunity.

I enjoy reading novels, hiking, and catching up on my favorite TV shows during my free time. In Nepal, when I have free time, I go explore more of KTM city and visit family.



MEDICAL MISTAKES: SOLVING A PUZZLE WITH INCOMPLETE PIECES


A 40-year-old female came to an emergency department with pain in her right upper part of her abdomen. The pain had started after she had a hamburger and fries at a local restaurant. It has been 7 hours after she ate, and the pain is getting worse. She now has a fever. When pressing on the right upper side of the stomach, she experiences a lot of pain. This is a classic presentation of cholecystitis. Cholecystitis is inflammation of gallbladder which is most commonly caused by stones in the gallbladder. If someone has cholecystitis, the treatment is to surgically take out the gallbladder. If cholecystitis is not treated, the chance of death is very high. Gallstones are present in about 30% of women in their 3rd and 4th decade of life. However, for most patients, gallstones just stay in the gallbladder and never lead to cholecystitis.

To confirm the diagnosis of cholecystitis in our patient, an ultrasound of her abdomen was done. Ultrasound showed that she had gallstones, but it did not show cholecystitis. Patient's history and exam tell us that she has cholecystitis, but ultrasound says she doesn't have cholecystitis. If the surgeon performs cholecystectomy (surgery to take a gallbladder out), but she turns out not having cholecystitis, the patient underwent an unnecessary surgery. However, if the surgeon decides not to do the surgery and the patient turns out to have cholecystitis, the chance that she would die is very high. In our case, a decision was made to do the surgery. When the surgeon cut open the woman's abdomen, he noticed that the patient did not have a gallbladder. What? How is this possible? If she did not have a gallbladder, how did the ultrasound show stones inside a gallbladder?

No one had an answer. To find the answer to this mysterious case, a special imaging test called ERCP was performed. From ERCP, they found that the patient did not have a gallbladder. She was born without one. She was found to have a really big common bile duct filled with stones. It was this common bile duct which had looked similar to gallbladder on ultrasound. The common bile duct is a duct that passes bile from the liver to intestines. With help of ERCP, the doctors were finally able to take out the stones from the common bile duct. In the case, the patient underwent an unnecessary surgery. If MRI or CT of the abdomen would have been performed instead of an ultrasound, it may have been known that she did not have a gallbladder and the stones were in her common bile duct. The problem would have been accurately diagnosed and she would have gone straight to ERCP. It is often challenging to do the right thing in medicine. It is because no two human bodies are the same. What applies true for 99 patients may not be true for the 100th patient. Absent gallbladders are incredibly rare. Ironically, the patient underwent a surgery to get her gallbladder taken out because she was born

In this article, I will try to explain why doing the right thing in medicine is often hard. Making mistakes is a part of our job.

Solving a puzzle with incomplete pieces Anyone coming to a clinic with a headache has a small chance that the headache is caused by a brain cancer. A doctor can use information from a patient's history to decide whether the patient has a brain



cancer. For example, patients with brain cancer usually have vomiting, weight loss, blurry vision, personality changes, walking difficulty, to name a few findings. Compared to a patient's history, a MRI of the head is much better at telling whether someone has a brain cancer. For a patient with a headache, when a doctor chooses to rely on the patient's history instead of a MRI, there is a chance that the doctor will miss a diagnosis of brain cancer.

A very smart doctor whom I think as an excellent clinician has made this mistake. A 33-year-old female came to her clinic with a headache and vomiting for about 2 months. The patient had just undergone a divorce and was in significant emotional distress. The doctor thought that the headache and vomiting were from the stress in her life. She gave the patient some medications and sent her home. She did not order a brain MRI. Two months later, the patient fainted at her work and was taken to an emergency department (ED). In the ED, they performed a MRI of the brain which showed an aggressive form of brain cancer called Glioblastoma Multiforme. Patients with this cancer usually don't live more than 6 months after diagnosis. Had the patient been diagnosed with brain cancer at her clinic visit, she may have lived longer. Did I think of this doctor as being less smart because of this mistake? Absolutely not. If I was in her place, I would have done the same thing. I would not have ordered a brain MRI. Imagine you are given a puzzle to solve but you are not given all the pieces. You can ask for extra pieces, but you have to pay for them. Doctors are such puzzle solvers. The diseases we diagnose are the puzzle. Patient's history, physical exam findings, labs, imaging and other tests we order are the puzzle pieces. Every time we ask our patients to bring us an extra piece of a puzzle, the patient has to spend extra time, money, and resources. Therefore, doctors are often forced to solve the puzzle with limited pieces.


The case of brain cancer I described earlier is a great example of trying to solve a puzzle with

incomplete pieces. Ordering a brain MRI on everyone coming to a clinic with a headache and vomiting is not practical. First, it costs a lot of money. Second, there are simply not enough MRI machines in the world to scan everyone with a headache and vomiting. Third, there was a perfect reason for why the patient was having a headache and vomiting in this case. Emotional stress causes lots of health issues, headache and vomiting being common ones. Using incomplete puzzle pieces to solve a puzzle always makes us prone to error. In the prior example of absent gallbladder, the doctor could have chosen CT or MRI over ultrasound. However, CT exposes a patient to harmful radiation. MRI is much expensive compared to ultrasound and is not usually readily available. In such case, ordering an ultrasound was appropriate. Most patients have a gallbladder. So, it didn't cross the doctor's mind that this patient may not have a gallbladder.

You can't buy any more puzzle pieces

Let's talk about appendicitis. Appendicitis is considered to be a clinical diagnosis. Clinical diagnosis is when a doctor diagnoses a disease by asking patients questions about the illness and examining them. Someone with appendicitis usually presents with pain in their right lower side of the abdomen. This pain usually originates around the belly button and migrates to the final place over a few hours. Patients have stiff abdomen due to their pain and fever due to the inflamed appendix. Patients don't want to move their abdomen, therefore lie stiff and rigid in bed.

These days, it is usual practice in modern societies to order ultrasound or CT before diagnosing someone with appendicitis. Treatment for appendicitis is appendectomy - surgery to take the appendix out. If we go back 20 years ago, ultrasound and CT were not widely available. In that time, doctors used to diagnose appendicitis clinically, and proceed with an appendectomy. When imaging was not routinely used for diagnosis, about 20-25% of those patients who underwent appendectomy were found to not



have appendicitis. They had a normal appendix. The doctors made a wrong diagnosis of appendicitis. This was considered an acceptable practice because if you leave appendicitis untreated, most patients end up dying.

After CT and ultrasound are routinely used for diagnosis of appendicitis, the wrong diagnosis of appendicitis went down to 10-15% from 20-25%. Currently, one in ten patients who undergo appendectomy has a normal appendix. What I want to highlight here is that the results are not still perfect.


Appendicitis is a relatively simple diagnosis to make. I can teach a 10th-grade student to diagnose one. However, many other diseases are harder to diagnose. In those complicated diseases, false diagnosis is very common. Patients are given one diagnosis, then another, and another, and the process can last for years. In some cases, we never know the diagnosis. Sometimes, no matter how many puzzle pieces we buy, we can't solve the puzzle. Maybe some puzzle pieces don't exist yet. We are still discovering new lab tests, new imaging exams, and new diseases. Our understanding of medicine is limited. The human body is incredibly hard to understand. Until we fully understand the human body, we will continue to make mistakes in diagnosing and treating patients.

Conclusion

When I was a medical student, a doctor in the emergency department told me, "one sad part about being an emergency medicine physician is that we have to be ok with the fact that one day we will kill someone. Maybe we will think that a patient is healthy and discharge them home, and they will die because they were not healthy enough to leave the hospital. Or maybe we will think that they are sick and offer a treatment, and the treatment itself will kill them." I never forgot what she said. Not only in emergency medicine, I think it is possible to kill patients in many fields of medicine, despite having the best intention in our mind.

Just like a car mechanic sometimes makes a car worse while trying to fix it, we sometimes make patients worse by trying to "fix" them. A car mechanic can say that a car is too broken to be fixed. We usually don't say that a patient is too sick to be taken care of. We have to try our best on everyone, no matter how "broken" they are. When cars are broken, some of its parts may be replaced. Replacing parts of a human being requires an organ transplant, which is unavailable to most people in the world.

Medicine as a field is very broad. It is always changing and expanding. Doctors are the gatekeepers of this field. We make plenty of mistakes. Some of those mistakes are inevitable because our understanding of the field is limited.



KIRAN AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Kiran, which means 'ray of light' in Hindi, is a non-profit organization that serves and empowers South Asian victims of domestic violence all across North Carolina. Kiran began in 1998 as

a volunteer-run organization to address the growing needs of the South Asian community in the Triangle. At the time, Kiran ran a crisis hotline and provided confidential counseling, support groups, and case management services with referrals coming from community members and local centers that were illequipped either culturally or linguistically to deal with the diverse South Asian population of survivors. In 2008, Kiran became a federally funded non-profit organization, creating a path of hope to victims and survivors of domestic violence. Kiran currently provides culturally-sensitive services to victims from the following countries: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Myanmar (Burma), Nepal, Pakistan, & Sri Lanka. These services include crisis counseling, resource referrals, safety planning, client advocacy, secondary family services, secure housing, translation assistance and empowerment. We believe in a holistic approach to addressing gender violence in the South Asian community.

According to a 2010 report issued by the Pew Research Center, Asians comprised 2.65% of North Carolina's population (252,585 residents). Data from 2013 indicated that the Asian population in Wake County was 59,000, representing 6.1% of all residents. The second largest Asian population was in Mecklenburg (51,000), followed by Guilford (23,000), Durham (14,000), and Orange (11,000). There are approximately 90 domestic violence agencies and shelters located throughout the state of North Carolina. However, Kiran is the only domestic violence agency in the area that has the specific tools to assist the

South Asian community.

Domestic violence is a public health issue that warrants concern. One out of three women will experience domestic violence/intimate partner violence in their lifetime. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), 37.7% percentage of intimate partner violence is prevalent in the Southeast Asia region. Due to the nature of abuse among South Asians, there area number of elements and unique cultural factors that complicate identification of abuseand help-seeking. These elements include the stigma of divorce, collectivism, patriarchy, joint family households, and immigration/ visa dependency. These challenges leave South Asian victims vulnerable to multi-pronged crises that set apart these clients from the average client at a mainstream program. This makes Kiran's work even more instrumental.

Kiran strives to increase opportunities for clients to build skills and access the resources necessary to

become fully self-sufficient. In 2017, we served 198 clients in North Carolina, many of whom contacted Kiran through our 24/7 Crisis Hotline (1-877-625-4726). Kiran's Crisis Hotline is a confidential, volunteer-run resource for South Asians in North Carolina. Along with active intensive client case management includes Kiran's Empowerment Program. This program provides mental and emotional counseling services by certified psychologists and psychiatrists, and a yoga support group, which emphasizes on mindfulness, actively practicing selfcare, and healing techniques for our clients. A large part of Kiran's work is focused on providing services to clients, however, Kiran also creates awareness by doing outreach events. From January 2017 to June 2018, Kiran conducted 29 outreach events including presenting in various conferences, religious and cultural groups, creating dialogues with law enforcement and universities, and hosting Kiran events such as the Walkathon and Bazaar. One of the major outreach programs Kiran conducts are Teen Empowerment Workshops, which aim to provide South Asian youth with information and resources that are beneficial to leading healthy and safe lifestyles among family, friends, and relationships. The impact on discussing these topics allows teens to be better aware of their surroundings and empower them to assist other teens who are going through similar experiences. Kiran also created two social media campaigns called Humans of Kiran and #Men Support Kiran as means of spreading awareness and outreach among the South Asian Community through an online platform.

In order to successfully execute our community impact goals, Kiran heavily relies on the support and commitment of our highly skilled volunteers. All volunteers attend a basic Kiran volunteer training and an additional training for those interested in participating in the crisis hotline. In this regard, our hotline volunteers serve as the crucial conduit between providing immediate assistance and then connecting the callers to office staff who follow up with intensive casemanagementandresourcereferrals.Kiranvolunt eershaveassistedinvariousoutreach and tabling events throughout the year. They also provide valuable assistance with transportation for client, translation services and serving as advocates for Kiran in the community. Volunteers are re-trained once a year so they can stay informed about new initiatives at Kiran, revisit volunteer procedures and protocols as well as provide Kiran staff with valuable feedback on what they see in the community. 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CHOICES AS SIMPLE AS 0123

Alcohol and drug addiction has been categorized as a progressive disease by American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) recently as it meets the qualifiers (etiology, progressive nature and treatable conditions) to be considered as a disease. High risk alcohol and drug use has been one of the major factors for vehicular accidents in American roads, resulting premature death. Alcohol and drug use affects negatively to any people(young, older, male, female, blacks, Latinos or Asians) who makes high risk alcohol and drug use. It is not kind of people who develop alcoholism and drug addiction; it is rather the kind of choices people make. Like heart disease; alcohol and drug addiction is also life style related health problems. Therefore, it is imperative to understand and be educated for all of us to know how much alcohol use is considered a low risk for overall health. Prevention Research Institute (PRI) explains 'Low risk guideline 0123' as a low risk guideline in a situation when alcohol use is unavoidable in order to educate people who likes to drink but has not yet developed full blown alcoholism/addiction. This formula only applies when there is no genetic predisposition of alcohol and drug addiction and no prescription medication is in use.


According to PRI, the following amount of alcohol use is considered as low risk for people with no family history of alcoholism and no prescription medication is being used: consuming 1 standard drink per hour, per day or 2 standard drinks in two hours each drink spacing an hour or consuming no

more than 3 drinks while spacing each drink in three hours duration. At any day consuming more than 3 drinks is considered high risk alcohol use. A standard drinks means a 12oz beer or a 5oz of table wine or 1.5oz of distilled spirit/liquor. 0 number of drink is recommended if you have family history of alcoholism/addiction (genetic predisposition) and you are taking prescription medications. Low risk alcohol/drug use is different to each person since genetic makeup of each individual is unique or different. Therefore, low risk guideline is determined by family history; trigger point and tolerance levels that are preset by your biology.

Since we have no control over our biology, we have some control over our choices. Whether to make low risk choices or not is entirely upto us, however, social and psychological factors are present which consistently influences our choices. Understanding these external factors and recognizing your psychological influences helps not only prevent future problems but also protects what you value for life. Once you start making high risk alcohol and drug use we start losing the things we value the most. It only takes one time of high risk alcohol and drugs use or one last drink to get into devastating accident that can steal your pride or joy for the rest of your life. The results can be unthinkable and losses can be forever. It can change our life from promising future to irreparable life situation. Making low risk choices consistently is very important not only to protect the things we value the most but also live healthy, stress free and productive life.





IMMIGRANTS OF AMERICA

In today's political climate, it's easy for immigrants to feel rattled. Stories about travel bans and family separations seem standard when turning on the news. It's unsettling to be an American right now, especially for immigrants. And while it's true that the Trump administration doesn't equally represent the rest of America, it is very clear that for the past two years, America has been more divisive than ever.

Under the Trump administration, immigrants have been a clear target of the White House. The United States Citizen and Immigration Services took the words "nation of immigrants" out of its which began to construe as the symbol of the government's rejection of outsiders. President Trump has made it clear that his agenda embraces the idea of limiting immigrants in America. He has already proposed the end of the Diversity Visa Program (DV), claiming that countries send 'people they don't want', from their home countries to the US. (CNN Politics) In reality, the DV program aims to diversify the immigrant population in the United States. Senate Democrats originally created the Diversity Visa Lottery in 1990 and the top receiving country under the program is Nepal.

Furthermore, a new policy change at the United States Citizens and Immigration Services is the next step toward what looks like a nationwide purge of non-citizens. On June 28 2018, the that non-citizens (such as permanent residents and students with visas) who apply for a "benefit", such as an extension or change of status, a green card, or citizenship, would be placed in deportation proceedings if that benefit is denied. Before this ruling, a criminal conviction would have been required for deportation to be an option. Now, merely losing your petition for visa extension will fast track you to deportation. Once in the process for deportation, the non-citizen must prove he or she is eligible to stay in the United States. A lawyer will not provided for those who

are being detained. The non-citizen will no longer have a right to a speedy trial, nor trial by jury. Many immigrants from places like Southeast Asia may not feel threatened by Trump's anti-immigrant rhetoric. Immigrants from Latin America and Muslim nations are the ones under fire right now but other immigrants shouldn't just stand idly by. Trump's anti-immigrant bias affects every immigrant. According to the FBI recent report, hate crimes have surged since the 2016 election. White Supremacist groups and Neo-Nazis feel empowered by Trump and have gotten more active since 2016. According to the New York Times, the Supreme Court ruled that immigrants held in detention are. The Court also to take up a case that deals with the DACA program, sending it back to the Ninth Circuit instead. Since the 2016 election, Trump is encouraging a crackdown on legal immigrants as well. Since Trump was elected, I have seen a blatant ignorance in my own community. When hearing about certain injustices, people will pause for a second and murmur 'that's terrible' and move on with their lives. They are dormant, and they are not going to wake up until they are directly affected. I want to remind everyone that their opinion matters. If you are a citizen, vote for your state and local elections. There is no level of government that is more directly responsible for serving your community than your local elected officials. They affect every aspect of your daily life including school quality, rent costs, and public safety. If federal representatives aren't making progress in area that you care about, it is the responsibility of local government to take action. And don't ignore Americans who are being persecuted because you wouldn't want to feel ignored if the tables were turned. I urge young people and permanent residents to become activists in their local communities. Policies affect everyone so make sure you are being represented.

MAGNETARS

Before we start, I should explain what a neutron star is. A neutron star is a star that had a mass anywhere from 3M (three times the mass of our sun) to 19M (19 times the mass of our sun). Stars that are smaller than 3M turn into something called white dwarfs. Stars that are bigger than 19M turn into something called black holes. Usually, stars with Bigger Masses turn into more powerful neutron stars. Neutron stars are an interesting type of dead stars because the different types each have different things they can do. Radio pulsars release extremely powerful radio waves that bend space while traveling, Millisecond pulsars spin so fast that they can spin thousands of times in one second, and last but not least, Magnetars are the most powerful out of all neutron stars.

Well, what exactly are magnetars? Magnetars are a type of neutron stars with extremely powerful magnetic attraction (like the name implies). Their magnetic attraction is from 1000 trillion times more powerful than Earth's magnetic field to 1 million quintillion times more powerful then earth's magnetic field. They're so powerful that they can swipe away your credit cards from over 100 million miles away, and tear off your earrings from 50 million miles away. If you got just a few million miles of it, the magnetism would be so intense that it would strip the iron from your blood and stop heart function.

In 2004, scientists were struck by a massive blast from an object 50,000 light years away in the Milky Way Galaxy. This blast was caused by a Megaflare, and it was bigger than anything that has been observed before. In fact, it was the largest burst of power ever recorded in our galaxy. Megaflares on neutron stars only happen when so called "star quakes" occur. In this specific incident, the outer layer of the neutron star slipped half a centimeter but since neutron stars hold the mass of stars in 20 km balls, they are super dense making the ½ centimeter slip powerful. It sent out a shockwave that we observed halfway across the galaxy. Scientists are now thinking about ways to harness the power of these Magnetars. If this is done right, we might get over billions and billions of times more energy from Magnetars than we do from coal and other man made fossil fuels. The possibilities of this new found energy source are looking like they are unlimited right now.

In conclusion, Magnetars are a recently discovered type of neutron star and hold a lot to learn. There's still so much to learn about these interesting stars. We're not exactly sure what makes Magnetars so frighteningly magnetic, but they "Retire" after about 10,000 years or so. They're still extremely magnetic in that period and just as dense but they aren't as bad.

I am Savanna Aryal from North Carolina. In Raleigh and surrounding parts of North Carolina there is a Nepalese association called NCNC. It stands for the Nepalese Center of North Carolina. In this community, people come together as a family to show that we are Nepalese people, help each other in need and that we are proud to be Nepalese. The main purpose of NCNC is to keep the Nepalese tradition going on and to teach younger children where we come. NCNC organizes lots of programs. There is one in particular that was very appealing to me. It is called Nepal Day. The Nepalese people discussed about celebrating Nepal day for few years. Once it was finalized by the community, this was brought into discussion with the mayor of Morrisville in 2016. In 2017 the Morrisville Mayor, Mark Stohlman, proclaimed the third Saturday on April as Nepal day. This year in 2018, Wake County has also declared Nepal Day.

So far NCNC held two Nepal Day parades. A week before the parade, we the volunteers, gatheredat a place to make posters and the Nepalese and American flag for Nepal day. We spent at least two to three hours to make posters. A day before the parade, the volunteers gathered again to decorate the truck that was used by other volunteers to carry the Hindu gods

and goddesses during the parade.

This year at the parade, we gathered at Cedar Fork Elementary in Morrisville, NC. We started distributing posters that we made last week along with the American and Nepalese flag stickers to participators. The Panchakanyas (five young girls) welcomed the chief guests (the Nepalese ambassador) by giving him a flower necklace made by real flowers. We also welcomed the Mayor of Morrisville, Mr. T.J Crawley, and a few Wake County representatives. After welcoming the chief guests and, we marched two miles to Church Street Park. During the parade the gods and goddesses i.e Buddha, Mahadev and Parvathi along with the Panchakanyas were carried on the decorated truck. Buddha was in Nepal day

because he was born in Nepal and is now considered a mentor. Mahadev and Parvathi were also there because both of them meditated up in the Himalayas where it was peace and quiet. These Hindu gods and goddesses are Nepalese people dressed up like real gods and goddesses. Music from Nepal was played during the parade such as Nepalese drums and chimes. After two miles of marching, the parade turned into a cultural program. We started the cultural program with the national anthem from both countries. After the national anthem the chief guests gave speeches highlighting the importance of Nepal Day and Nepal. After the speeches, the gods and goddesses danced in traditional Nepalese followed by a dance from different Nepalese people dressed up like different tribes in Nepal. There was also a dance called the Lakhe dance where there is a monster called a Lakhe and the Lakhe is supposed to scare all the children that go near him. 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WHY REST IN PEACE (RIP) AFTER DEATH?

"SARVE BHAVANTU SUKHINAH, SARVE SANTU NIRAMAYAH SARVE BHADRANI PASHYANTU, MA KASHCHIT DUKKHA BHAGBHAVET OM SHANTIH SHANTIHSHANTIH"

"May all be happy, may all be free from illness May all see goodness, may no one suffer

OM peace peacepeace"

The above shloka, commonly known as SHANTI mantra, is from ancient Upanishads. It is chanted usually at the end of Hindu rituals to wish peace for everyone. Peace has been recognized as the fundamental requirement for living healthy, happy and purposeful life since ancient times. In yet another Vedic shloka, peace is wished not just for humans but also for plants, water, sky, and so on. Without peace, we cannot enjoy anything in life. If there is no peace, we cannot enjoy our meal, music, sleep, or anything else. Therefore, peace is needed right here when we are still alive. No wonder ancient Hindu texts wish peace for everyone and everything since we really need peacewhen we are alive. Why then it is popular to wish 'Rest in Peace (RIP)' after death? To know the answer, let's know the historical context for the usage of RIP, and then analyze whether it makes sense to wish RIP for the dead.

Use of RIP for the dead is common in Christianity and Judaism. One of the earliest uses of a phrase similar to RIP was found on gravestones dating 2100 years ago in the graveyard of Bet Shearim (in present day Israel). The phrase in Hebrew, "Requiesce cat in pace" means 'come and rest in peace' probably because the person did not have peace in his life time. A similar expression was found in the catacombs of the early Christians. The phrase, 'dormit in pace' ('he sleeps in peace') indicated that 'they died in the peace of the Church' since there was violence everywhere at the time. Thus, it appears that peace was an unfulfilled dream for the people living in that part of the world at that time. Therefore, the wish was that they would be in peace at or after death. The phrase RIP is now commonly found in tombs of Christians and is a popular expression in social media all over the world. Most likely the use of RIP has its origin in the Bible. Bible refers to those dead in Christ as "those who are asleep" (for example, 1 Corinthians 15:20, Acts 13:36, and in other places). According to Daniel 12:3, an angel speaks of Daniel's death, saying, "you will rest". Again, Isaiah 57:2, "those who walk uprightly enter into peace, they find rest as they lie in death". In Abrahamic faiths (Christianity, Islam and Judaism),

bodily death is only temporary. On the day of the last judgement, the dead will come alive in their physical body (the resurrection). Until then, the dead body is just resting. Thus, RIP is a common wish for the dead in Abrahamic faiths.

In Dharmikacultures (Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism, Sikhism, etc.), the traditional wish for the JEEVATMA(not soul) of the dead body is to attain MOKSHA, MUKTÍ, NIRVANAor ŠAD GATI. MOKSHA/MUKTI/NIRVANA means freedom from the cycle of birth and death (and union with the PARMATMA, BRAHMANA or nothingness). SAD GATI means to obtain the higher status than the immediate past life. The use of RIP for the dead in Dharmika cultures is a recent phenomenon, likely started by English speaking people during British rule of the Indian sub-continent. The usage has now crept into many other non-English languages of the sub-continent. JEEVATMA is a reflection of ATMA (which is eternal same as *Brahma*or *Parmatma*) as influenced by subtle body, mind and intellect of a particular individual. JEEVATMA or ATMA as known by followers of Dharmika traditions is not the same as SOUL in Abrahamic religions even though people literally use soul for ATMA. The key distinction is that soul does not re-incarnate, whereas JEEVATMA does. (Please note that ATMA is neither born nor dies.) In Abrahamic faiths, the fate of the body and soul is sealed at the time of death, hell or heaven. For DharmikaJ EEVATMA, the cycle of birth and death continues until KARMA is exhausted and MOKSHA/MUKTI/ NIRVANAis achieved. There is no eternal hell or heaven for JEEVATMA. The physical body is very earthly, which does not have any further use for the JEEVATMA after death. There is no resurrection in Dharmika traditions. JEEVATMA does not have any sense organs and mind after the death of the body. But peace can only be experienced through senses and mind. Therefore, wishing RIP for the dead does not make

Expressions are very much a reflection of the culture and living conditions of the people in that culture. In Abrahamic faiths (originating in the Middle East), it appears that peace is the highest goal probably due to constant violence and war in that part of the world. In Dharmika traditions, peace is not the highest but the basic requirement to achieve other higher goals. Peace cannot be the ultimate goal and definitely not for the dead. Therefore, be mindful of what you want to wish for a departed *JEEVATMA* next time.

RICE PLANTATION IN THE LOWER CAPE FEAR, NORTH CAROLINA



Every time I drive through the Lower Cape Fear River (LCFR) watershed in North Carolina (NC). my eyes always catch the sign "Plantations." Often, I wonder if this sign is referring to pulpwood production of paper industry or corn and soybean production for hog harm industries. However, I never delved into understanding its significance until this year, 2018, when my wife Nirmala's eyes caught the sign again. My curiosity drove me to google and was surprised to find information that has symbiotic relationship with my daily eating grain, rice. It is rice plantation that is being practiced since more than 300 years ago in the watershed. The "Plantations" sign literally stands for the estates of Orton, Kendall, Lilliput, Pleasant Oaks, and Belvedere. Rice was a major economic drive for these plantations for roughly 100 years (1731 – 1830). Only Orton Plantation still stands in the watershed for promoting rice. In the memory of its historic revolution, NC Rice Festival is celebrated every year in September with food, fun, art, crafts, educational activities, and live music at the Brunswick Riverwalk Park in Belville.

Evolution of Rice in North Carolina

The practice of harvesting rice in NC started afterRoger Moore, son of and grandson of, and his family moved from the to southeastern in 1724, and started taking a notable interest in development of the LCFR area. He joined with his brothers, Colonel and Nathaniel, to seek land grants in the area. By 1727 Roger accumulated more than seven thousand acres and built a fine plantation house called "Kendall." Four years later he expanded his plantation house to nearly twenty-five thousand acres. Approximately twenty years later he built a one-story plantation house called at a magnificent site overlooking the river near Brunswick town.



B e s i d e plantations, Roger was also active politically in the Lower Cape Fear regions. He held several provincial and local offices. He was assistant justice of the General Court in 1732, a justice of the peace for in 1734, a commissioner for the in 1735, and a member of the royal Council from 1734 until his death in 1751. Because of his grand manner and his reputation as a generous host, Roger was often referred to as "King Roger."He was survived by his wife and five children.

Roger determined that his Kendall and Orton estates would be ideal for rice production based on the fact LCFR is a low-lying marshland bordered by fresh tidal water. The soils were rich, reasonably flat and highly fertile. However, developing a rice field proved to be herculean task. To begin with, the marshland was inhibited by many old and tall trees; of which had to be cleared.

Additionally, levees and dams had to be built before the rice was panted. This was done to flood the area. During growing season, the rice field was needed to dam up the river to allow the crops to continue to flourish. Consequently, he brought in nearly 250 slaves from South Carolina to do laborious work. Majority of these slaves werebrought from West Africa where the natives had been raising rice for several hundred years. By the 1690s, planters who had settled in South Carolina had purchased these enslaved persons directly from West Africa for planting rice. They knew how to prepare fields and how to grow, harvest and use rice.

After Roger, several planters practiced planting rice at the adjoining lands of the LCFRin Brunswick County and Hanover County. The plantation north of Kendall is Lilliput, which was granted in 1725 to Eleazer Allen, an educated gentleman and native of Massachusetts. Next above Lilliput is the plantation called Pleasant Oaks, granted to the widow of John Moore, (another brother of Maurice and Roger) in 1728. Then came Belvidere, owned by Col. Wm. Dry, and later by Governor Ben Smith. This place is nearly opposite the City of Wilmington. During the colonial periods, rice was established as a major crop for the colonists in North Carolina. The planters shipped more than 300 tons of American rice, popularly known as "Carolina Gold Rice," to England. They were producing more rice than there were ships to carry it.

Downturn of Rice in North Carolina

It appears that the following four circumstances affected the historical market of rice in NC. First, the end of civil war in 1865 brought almost total chaos to the planters due to sudden regulation of of slaves. The planters then faced two major problems. They were securing adequate resources to finance the crop and arriving at a suitable work



arrangementwith the emancipated slaves. Borrowing was the planters' only financial recourse; however, the excessive interest rate—sometimes as high as 2½ to 3 percent per month—

virtually deprived them of rice planting interest among the major owners of Orton, Kendall, Lilliput, Belvedere, and Pleasant Oaks. Consequently, the rice plantations on the LCFR went largely unplanted. The only rice reported was that in small patches here and there, cultivated by slavesfor themselves. Second, during the colonial period, a new industry, Naval stores such as tar, pitch, and turpentine, began to emerge as a potential economic growth and immediate returns on the planters' investment. Rice, however, seems to have occupied a strong secondary position in the economy in the LCFR from the beginning.

Third, downsize of commercial rice production came in the late 1800s, when a series of large hurricanes damaged the old rice fields beyond repair in the LCFR.

Fourth, competition from established rice growers in Arkansas, California, Louisiana, Texas, Missouri and Mississippi and other states in the Deep South caused growing rice in the Cape Fear River to fail.Farmers in these states produce more than 20 billion pounds of rice each year, according to USA Rice Federation. While the NC planters do not contribute much to the commercial rice industry, it is however important to remember their revolutionary efforts of planting rice in the river basin. Given the difficulties, the Orton plantation owner has not given up planting rice in the LCFR. Five years ago, workers planted about 200 acres of rice along the river. The rice plants, however, could not be established well due to insects, cutworms, and salty and acidic soil. Since then, DillonEpp,who manages the property, has overseen an effort to improve the soil, reduce the threat of disease and find strains of rice that will thrive in the river basin. Last year, he planted nearly 40 acres on the most promising soil.

Bacon, a Raleigh native and a direct descendent of "King" Roger Moore, now hopes to restore the rice fields. He says that his effort to restoring the fields is for honoring the African slaves who built it and made it economically viable in the Cape Fear.

Rice Festivals in North Carolina

Every year in the month of September, Rice Festival is observed at Brunswick Riverwalk in Belville, celebrating historical evolution of rice plantations in the LCFR. The month of September was selected to mark the end of rice harvesting. In contract, Nepal celebrated rice planting on June/July to mark the start of planting.

This year marks the fifth annual North Carolina Rice Festival. There will be more fun with foods, arts and crafts, educational activities, and live music to celebrate the rich history of rice cultivation in the LCFR. Mouthwatering dishes such as shrimp gumbo, red beans and rice, creole dirty rice, and rice pudding will be served at the festival. The competitive 'Rice Cook-off' is one of the highlights of the festival with awards given out for seafood, meat, and vegetable rice combinations, along with dessert recipes.

Nevertheless, there will not be any vendors or volunteers to serve beer or liquor during the celebration. Interested participants may have to step over to nearby beer garden. In Nepal, during the festival, participants are usually feast with dahichiura (Yogurt and beaten rice) withlocally brewed alcohol. They also sing and dance to the local cultural tunes and partake in competition in sowing of rice saplings. Many of them also play with mud with friends and families.

Conclusion

Miles of rice fields along the bank of the Cape Fear River was a major economic driver for plantations such as Orton, Kendall, Lilliput, Pleasant Oaks, and Belvedere for roughly 100 years (approx. 1731 – 1830). Only Orton Plantation still stands. Due to the fact thatrice cultivation during this period was very labor intensive, hundreds of slaves were brought in to work the fields. In honor of their sacrifices, the Orton Plantation owner are still trying to restore the historic rice field in the LCFR.

The information stated above comes from my curiosity to understand and was acquired through limited resources. Interested readers may have more information. They are most welcome to share, comment, and/or suggest in this matter.

NEW FEDERAL STRUCTURE OF NEPAL

New constitution of Nepal was promulgated in 2015 September 20. According to the new constitution, following administrative divisions are to be established

New States/ Provinces

Seven federal states are formed in Nepal removing old 14 zones and 5 development regions. Old 75 districts are kept as it is (but with much less role). However, two districts among them (Nawalparasi & Rukum) are divided and assigned to two different provinces, which effectively made total 77 districts in Nepal. Name permanent capital city of the provinces will be given by 2/3 majority of the province's legislative.

State 4: Population - 2,413,907; Area 21,504 sqkm; Proposed name: Gandaki; Proposed Capital: Pokhara Districts - 10 and ½ (Gorkha, Lamjung, Tanahun, Kaski, Manang, Mustang, Parbat, Syangja, Myagdi, Baglung, Nawalparasi - east of BardaghatSusta)



The new 7 states are as follows:

State 1: Population - 4,534,943; Area - 25,905 sq km; Possible name: Sagarmatha; Temporary Capital:Biratnagar

Districts-14 (Taplejung, Panchthar, Ilam, Sankhuwasabha, Terhathum, Dhankuta, Bhojpur, Khotang, Solukhumbu, Okhaldhunga, Udayapur, Jhapa, Morang, Sunsari)

State 2: Population - 5,404,145; Area - 9,661 sq km; Possible name: Madhesh/Mithila/ Central Madhesh, Temporary Capital: Janakpur

Districts - 8 (Saptari, Siraha, Dhanusha, Mahottari, Sarlahi, Rautahat, Bara, Parsa)

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AN OPEN LETTER

"Every life is in many days, day after day. We walk through ourselves, meeting robbers, ghosts, giants, old men, young men, wives, widows, brothers-inlove, but always meeting ourselves."

By facilitating the potential for straight-forward dialogue and powerful prose, open letters have become an increasingly popular narrative style in recent years. What follows is an open letter to a street child I encountered during my upbringing in Kathmandu, Nepal. Unbeknownst to me at the time, these transient encounters would fundamentally mold my perception of the world and our collective role within it.


As a heatwave rippled through Kathmandu, I languished against the window of my grandmother's home, torpidly watching people drift through the dilapidated street below. I first spotted you amidst the crowd. You were abjectly poor with your clothes tattered and dirtied, but you nonetheless boasted a scathingly radiant smile. As I observed you more closely, I realized how frail and gaunt you really were. Concerned, I somehow evaded the watchful eye of my grandmother and slipped outside to offer you some water. Before I made it past the main entrance, a perceptiveneighbor seized me and exhorted "Stop! He's a vagrant, he's wretched. His suffering is his own." Startled by this exchange, you dolefully staggered away.

As Fate willed it, that was not the lasttime that I saw or thought about you. You gradually cemented yourself in my consciousness throughan idiosyncratic ritual of riding a dilapidated bicycle, your most prized possession, across the city each morning. Shrouded in the soft grey shadow of dawn,

I would prop myself against the window of my grandmother's bedroom and curiously watch your silhouette emerge through the shadows. More often than not, I was lulled back to sleepby the soothing rhythm of your pedaling; Rubber wheels churning upon the earth like droplets of rain falling softly from the sky.

Through the passage of time and keen observation, I eventually learned that your early-morning sojourns were borne out of desperation; This was only time of day you could forage through the streets for scraps of food or clothes without enduring a barrage of abuse from onlookers. One day, you abruptly disappeared, and a reverberating, paralyzing silence replaced the comforting sound of your bicycle approaching in the distance. Soon after, I moved to America but never forgot about you. To this day, I try to imagine that you miraculously found a loving a family and no longer had to roam the streets to survive. Unfortunately, I am painfully aware that the circumstances of your absence are most likely far more sinister than that.

Throughout your life you were forced to wear your social status like a scarlet letter while most people had the luxury of taking a fleeting glance in your direction and swiftly turning away. Those fleeting moment have immeasurably shaped who I am today. As a timid child, I did not have the power or courage to help alleviate your suffering. As an adult with more autonomy, I am determined to, metaphorically-speaking, provide the proverbial water to anyone in need. Your presence in my life taught me that we have an opportunity every single day to decide the kind of world we want to live in.



US-NEPAL ECONOMIC RELATIONSHIPS & TRADE INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES IN NEPAL

1. US Nepal Diplomatic and Economic Relations Nepal enjoys smooth bilateral relations with USA based on friendship, mutual respect and cooperation between two countries. Exchange of visits and interactions at various levels helped promote and strengthen bilateral relations. Nepal – USA diplomatic relations was established on April 25. 1947. Nepal established its Embassy in Washington DC on February 3, 1958. American Embassy in Kathmandu was opened on August 6, 1959. USA continuously provided development assistance to Nepal ever since the establishment of diplomatic relations. In recent years, annual bilateral US economic assistance through the USAID ranges between US \$75 to \$80 million. In addition, US government pledged US \$ 130 million during the "International Conference on Nepal's Reconstruction" held in Kathmandu in June 2015 for the reconstruction and rehabilitation works of Nepal after the devastating earthquake of April 2015. Recently, USA has provided USD 500 million Millennium Challenge Corporations (MCC) grant assistance for the development of energy and

Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA) was signed on April 15, 2011 with the objectives of expanding of trade, investment and technical cooperation and strengthening economic relations between the two countries. Both countries are having bilateral dialogue every year under this mechanism. In 2017, Nepal exported USD 87 million worth of Nepalese products to USA and imported USD 82 million worth of products from USA. Nepal's major export items are carpets, garments, handicrafts, pashmina and major import items are soybeans, mechanical parts, medical and surgical equipments, laboratory regents, dry foods.

transportation sector.

The FDI from USA to Nepal up to FY 2015-16 reached USD 72 million with 334 businesses registered during the period for organic vegetables, solar energy, garments, data outsourcing, pet food, cement, coffee, consultancy services, restaurants, hotels

In 2017, 80,000 tourists travel Nepal from USA which is 8.2% of total tourist arrivals of Nepal. Major tourism activities for US tourist in Nepal are trekking/hiking, expeditions, biking, bungee jumping, rock climbing, para -gliding, water rafting,

mountain flights, historical sites visits. Similarly, over 11,000 Nepalese students are studying in USA in 2017.

This shows that Nepal- USA bilateral relation covers multi faceted dimensions which need to be further strengthened in the days to come.

2. Trade and Investment Opportunities in Nepal Nepal is strategically located between two large and rapidly growing economies – China and India – with easy access to markets of more than 2.6 billion people. Nepal has duty free and open border access to India and duty free access to China, quota free duty free access to EU under Everything but Arms (EBA) arrangements which provided significant market access to Nepalese products abroad. Nepal has provided various incentive packages to attract domestic and foreign investors including Nepalese Diaspora. Duty and tax free arrangements in the region as a Member of South Asian Free Trade Area (SAFTA) and the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) Free Trade Agreement have been made to attract FDI. The government of Nepal is committed to continuously improve investment environment in the country and open to discuss with investors for this matter.

Nepal is the land of fresh and flowing water. The topography and abundant water resources give rise to vast untapped hydropower potential. To tap the Himalayas, as this is the highest mountain range on Earth, and 8 of the world's 10 highest peaks, combined with unique cultural heritage, creating potential for tourism. In addition, incredibly rich biodiversity creates potential in agriculture and medicinal and aromatic plant research. In terms of trade relations with USA, US has recently provided Nepal a duty free facilities for 77 Nepalese products into the US market by a separate Act called "Trade Facilitation and Trade Enforcement Act of 2015" through December, 2025.

Investment Promotion and Protection Agreement (BIPPA) has been signed with 6 countries - Finland, India, Germany, Mauritius, United Kingdom, and France and double Taxation Avoidance Agreement signed with Austria, China, India, Korea, Mauritius, Norway, Pakistan, Qatar, Sri Lanka and Thailand to help attracting investment and ease the taxation matter. Nepal is also a member of Multilateral

Investment Guarantee Agency (MIGA) of the World Bank Group and the Member of World Trade Organization (WTO).

3. Brief Scenario of FDI in Nepal

Nepal has received USD 2 billion FDI in 2016 for 3,870 businesses. The top five countries for FDI are China (1110), India (658), USA (341), South Korea (311) and Japan (229). Out of which, remarkable portion of FDI is seen in Infrastructure (energy, telecommunication) and also in manufacturing sector. Approximately 58% of commitment for FDI is found in hydro-power sector. The next is service sector (banking, insurance, hotels/restaurants and education) considered most attractive business for FDI. Almost all banking, financing and insurance companies operating in Nepal under FDI are running in profit. Approximately 50% out of 10 major tax payer companies are under FDI. Nepalese Diaspora is much potential source of investment in Nepal. Nepal hosted a Nepal Investment Summit in 2017 in its Capital Kathmandu where 775 total delegates including 285 foreign delegates participated. Twenty six companies of 8 countries from China, India, Bangladesh, Japan, UK, Sri Lanka, and Nepal signed Letter of Intent (LOI). Pledged amount was USD 13.7 billion for 48 pledges in 10 sectors. LOI covers sectors such as hydropower, wind and solar plant, hospital, Metro, Airports, Tunnel Roads, Tourism and Agriculture infrastructure, pulp and paper, food processing, manufacturing, mining and minerals. This shows that Nepal is the next destination for investment.

4. Doing Business in Nepal

Foreign entities can own 100% of a business almost in all sectors in Nepal. The minimum amount required for FDI is USD 50,000. Any FDI require approval either from Department of Industry (DOI) or from the Investment Board of Nepal (IBN). Any project exceeding USD 20 million is handled by IBN, while smaller sized projects need approval from DOI. Any Company can be registered as private limited company or public limited company in Company Registrar Office. Similarly, any enterprises need to register for tax in Inland Revenue Department and get Permanent Account Number (PAN). Enterprises over USD 50,000 turnover need VAT registration as well. All businesses should get licenses from respective agencies, which are: for Bank and financial institutions- Nepal Rastra Bank (central Bank of Nepal), for Hotels/restaurants- Tourism Ministry, for Food- Department of Food Technology and Quality Control, for Pharmaceuticals-Department of Drug Management, for Hydropower-Department of Electricity Development, for Education- Ministry of Education and for HealthMinistry of Health. An investor is free to manage land under a registered company. They can open bank account in foreign currency. Visa is provided for longer period of time for investors.

5. US – Nepal Trade Scenario

Nepal's Trade with the world totaled \$660 million in 2015, with leading exports of spices, carpets, yarns, apparel, clothing accessories, and fruit juices. As the export trade with the United States nearly \$87 million in 2017, the export items are limited as carpets, apparel, and clothing accessories. The country has significantly lower tariffs on imports and offers investors and those looking for new sources of supply affordable labor, high profitability margins, lower land cost. a Nepal also enjoys preferential duty free treatment in a number of developed-country markets. The newest is the U.S.-Nepal Trade Preferences for 77 products for a period of 10 years through December 31, 20125. This does not need annual renewal like in GSP scheme. Various 77 products of Nepal is now eligible duty free in US borders which importers can save duty ranges from 3.3% to 20%. The 77 products include carpets, hats and gloves, handbags, pocket good, luggage and attaché cases, travel bags, headbands and needle crafts kits, shawls, scarf's and travel blankets.

6. Challenges and further Potentials in Trade relations

Current Nepal's export to USA is very small. The number of exports items are very limited and diversification to new items, based on our strength (niche products, packaging, branding) have not been explored. Example: Nepal's tea dust goes to Sri Lanka, packed nicely, branded as Sri Lankan Tea and comes to the US market. Nepalese tea dust directly comes to US in a very minimum quantity. The possibilities of export of bulky items carrying through ships are limited due to high transportation cost and far destination. Air cargo is expensive. The low scale of export items decreases the competitiveness in the market. Recently provided 77 duty free items are not explored much for possible exports items (travel bags, suitcase) based on product specific study of competitiveness. Perceived sense of weak investment environment, weak governance, corruption, many documents requirements also hampers the trader's mindset.

However, in a changing political context of Nepal, there are hopes rebounded in Nepal. Businesses are excited to increase their investment. Government has come up with increasing production strategies with a commitment to facilitate businesses through recently announced budget. Nepal is likable country in USA. Market is available for any products that are competitive. In USA, Nepal is identified as a

typical country with natural beauty, high mountains including Everest, over 100 ethnic cultures, organic potentials, traditional handicrafts, low weight high priced items. Nepal's exporters should be aware of vast US market which demands large scale quantity, continuous supply chain and quality. Therefore, product- wise deep study is needed to know exactly the situation of competitiveness and possibility of export potentials of each product. Nepal's exporters may think of diversify their products a bit and explore the possibility of large scale exports under 77 items, for example Travel good items such as bags, suitcase, blankets can be made in Nepal with USA technology and investment and be exported to USA. Other countries in our region like china, India should pay duty up to 17% for these items. Nepal Embassy in USA can disseminate information to US companies and traders and Ministry of Commerce can do the same in Nepal. Nepal Embassy in USA can do more with increased resources reaching out to US cities. E-commerce is potential for Nepal to sale items online- Amazon, Ali Baba type of companies can operate in Nepal. For this, Nepal Rastra bank should make e-payment system easier. Ministry of Commerce should prepare a situation paper so that Embassies can play role to reach out companies to attract.

7. Challenges and further Potentials in Investment relations

Globally, Nepal is still facing challenge for investment due to various reasons, political, bureaucratic, governance and corruption. Global indicators such as Doing Business Indicators, Corruption Index are still not supportive. USA is a far destination for Nepal. The possibility of US investment in bulky products for US domestic market is limited due to distance and high transportation cost. Therefore, product selection for US investment is very important. Nepalese Diaspora in USA has interest in investment in Nepal but they are still in wait and see mode. Larger scale regional cross border type of projects has not yet fully realized for larger scale investment that connects neighboring

countries for hydropower, tunnels, railways and cross border highways. Government of Nepal is initiating such projects with possible collaboration with private sectors. US Small and medium type investors are not much aware and confident of investing in Nepal due to distance, transportation hurdles, lack of trusted business partner, and limited information about the country.

However, there are immense opportunities moving forward. US – Nepal bilateral Trade and Investment mechanism (TIFA) is in place and is regular in meeting recent years. This mechanism encourages dialogue at government and private sector level, particularly for the understanding of the investment related issues such as labor, tax, land, intellectual property rights, customs, quality control, settlement of disputes. Large scale regional projects connecting Nepal, India, and Bangladesh in energy and transportation sector are possible and these may be of interest for larger American companies to invest in Nepal. Companies operating in China and India could be the target for Nepal which Nepal Embassies in Beijing, New Delhi and Washington DC can have joint information system network for tapping such companies. Tourism, health and education sectors are the potential sectors for US investment in Nepal. The Investment Summit in 2017 in Kathmandu enhanced the confidence of investors to look at Nepal. Nepalese Diaspora may come forward to contribute in knowledge and technology transfer provided Nepal create a right platform such as Think Tank institutions and access to policy dialogue for Nepal's brain abroad to discuss various policy and technological related issues. Small and medium size investors in USA may be attracted in niche products, Himalayan branded items, agro- forestry products (tea, coffee, herbs, ginger). Outreach to US companies is a must to let them know about Nepal's recent positive development in political, business environment, opportunities in Nepal where Embassy can play role to disseminate information, reach out investment and traders in vast US market across the 50 states.

ANTHONY BOURDAIN

On June 8th, 2018, Anthony Bourdain was found dead in his hotel room after committing suicide by hanging. So Today I'm going to tell you about the biography of this amazing celebrity chef.


Anthony Michael Bourdain was born on July 25th, 1956, in New York City. He had a younger brother named Christopher Bourdain and they were the son of Pierre Bourdain (an executive for Columbia Records) and Gladys Bourdain (a staff editor for The New York Times). Bourdain spent most of his childhood in Leonia, New Jersey. Thanks to his parents Bourdain developed a devotion to literature and rock music. Bourdain attended Vassar College for two years and then graduated from the world-renowned Culinary Institute of America in 1978.

From there he began running kitchens of New York restaurants such as the Supper Club, One-Fifth Avenue and Sullivan's. In 1989 he became the executive chef at Brasserie Les Halles. Bourdain remained the head chef for many years until Les Halles closed after filing for bankruptcy in 2017. While working at these restaurants, Bourdain published his book Kitchen Confidential: Adventures in the Culinary Underbelly (2000), a New York Times bestseller, which was an expansion of his 1999 New Yorker article "Don't Eat Before Reading This." A sequel to the book, Medium Raw: A Bloody Valentine to the World of Food and the People Who Cook, was published in 2010.

Bourdain wrote two more bestselling nonfiction books- A Cook's Tour (2001) which was a book talking about his food and travel experiences around the world, and The Nasty Bits (2006) another book centering his food. Because of Bourdain's book Kitchen Confidential, the food network offered him a chance to host his own food and world-travel show, called A Cook' Tour which premiered in January 2002 and ran for 35 episodes, through 2003. After that Bourdain premiered other television series such as No Reservations (2005–2012), The Layover (2011–2013), and Parts Unknown (2013–2018).

Bourdain married Nancy Putkoski his high school girlfriend in 1985. They stayed together for two decades, divorcing in 2005. Later he married Ottavia Busia in 2007. In that same year, the couple's daughter, Ariane, was born. In 2018 he was found dead in his hotel room. He died of suicide by hanging. Bourdain was working on an episode of Parts Unknown in nearby Strasbourg. Bourdain's mother, Gladys Bourdain, told The New York Times: "He is absolutely the last person in the world I would have ever dreamed would do something like this." CNN issued a statement, saying that Bourdain's "talents never ceased to amaze us and we will miss him very much." Former U.S. President Barack Obama, who dined with Bourdain in Vietnam on an episode of Parts Unknown, wrote on Twitter, "He taught us about food—but more importantly, about its ability to bring us together. To make us a little less afraid of the unknown."

After a few days from His death fans paid tribute to him outside his now-closed former place of employment, Brasserie Les Halles. And this is the story of how a loved celebrity chef took his own life

कङ्गोमा नेपाली व्यापारी

कड्गोको किन्सासा पुगेको केही दिनपछि एक जना कड्गोली महिलासँग मेरो राम्रै मित्रता हुन पुग्यो । उमेरमा मभन्दा केही कच्चा थिइन् उनी । हिस्सी परेको कालो अनुहार, पातलो जिउडाल, घुम्रेको कालो कपाल अनि दुवै कानमा चाँदी रङका टप । शारीरिक संरचना र रुपमा कुनै कमजोरी थिएन । हरेकपल्टको भेटमा देखिएको उनको निर्दोष र अबोध भावनाबाट म निकै प्रभावित भएँ । वास्तवमा मबाट उनले के अपेक्षा गरेकी थिइन्, मैले धेरै समयसम्म ख्याल गर्न सिकन तर उनीबाट मैले धेरै सहयोग पाइरहेको थिएँ । कड्गोको भित्री व्याख्या, महिलामाथिको दुर्व्यवहार, कड्गोली संस्कृति, भेषभुषा र भाषाको बारेमा निकै रोचक जानकारी लिइरहेको थिएँ मैले ।

"सर, यदि समाजमा अन्धविश्वास छ भने त्यसको पहिलो मार महिलाले नै भोग्न बाध्य हुन्छन् । त्यही अन्धविश्वासबाट कित कङ्गोली महिलाहरू बलात्कार र जबर्जस्तीको शिकार भएका छन् । बाध्यता खपेर बाँचेका छन् ।" केही दिनअगाडि कङ्गोमा घटेको बलात्कारको घटनालाई लिएर उनले मलाई यो कुरा सुनाएकी थिइन् । त्यो घटनाले उनलाई निकै ममहित बनाएको थियो । त्यितमात्र होइन उनका विषय-प्रसङ्ग निकै गहिरा-गहिरा हुन्थे । उनको पारिवारिक पृष्ठभूमि र विगतको दिनचर्याबारे मैले केही जान्न नखोजे पनि उनको मनोभावनाले व्यक्त गरिरहेको हुन्थ्यो । उनलाई सभ्यताको पूर्ण ज्ञान थियो । कङ्गोको दैनिक समाचार अध्याविध राख्ने उनको आदत थियो ।

केही दिनका लागि उनी हराएकी थिइन्। सधैँजसो भेट हुने व्यक्ति एकाएक हराएपछि न्यास्रोको अनुभव हुनु स्वाभाविक हो। उनीसँग काम नै नपरे पिन उनको अनुपस्थितिले मलाई खल्लो बनायो। उनका बारेमा अनेक कुराहरू मनमा खेलिरहे। ती काली महिला स्वाभाविक र सामान्य थिइन् तर प्राकृतिक नियमले दिएको आकर्षण शिक्तिले मलाई नराम्रोसँग खिच्यो। मैले आफ्नो आन्तिरिक इच्छालाई धोका दिन चाहिनँ। म पिन यही पृथ्वीको हावापानीमा हुर्केको सामान्य व्यक्ति हुँ। म असामान्य हुन सिकनँ। प्रकृतिको विपरीत दिशातिर बग्न सिकनँ। आफ्नो निर्बलता देखेर निकै पछतो पिन लाग्यो।

उनी एकाएक देखा परिन् । भेट हुनेबित्तिकै हँसिलो पारामा मलाई सुनाइन्-"तपाईं त नेपाली पो हुनुहुँदो रहेछ । नेपालबाट आउनुभएको हो ?" उनको सोधाइमा स्नेहका भावहरू आइरहेका थिए। यथार्थ लुकाउनुपर्ने आवश्यकता थिएन मलाई। तर उनको सोधाइप्रति थुप्रै जिज्ञासा देखा परे। तैपिन मैले स्वाभाविक रुपमा उत्तर दिएँ-"अनौठो लाग्यो? कसरी थाहा पायौ? हो म नेपालबाट आएको हुँ।"

"ठूलो मान्छे कहाँ त्यतिकै लुक्न सिकन्छ र ? मैले थाहा पाइहालें नि !" उनी जिस्कँदै बोलिन् ।

"म ठूलो मान्छे!" हामीलाई गौरवको अनुभूति भयो। म ठूलो मान्छे नभए पनि केही बेरका लागि अभ उनका लागि ठूलै मान्छे बनिदिएँ। "तपाईं किन कङ्गो आउन्भएको हो?" उनले फोर प्रश्न गरिन्।

"एउटा साथीको विवाह थियो, त्यही निम्तो मान्न ।" "विवाहको निम्तो मान्न ! त्यित टाढाबाट ?" उनलाई पत्याउन गाह्रो भयो ।

"किन होला त?" मैले प्रश्न गरें।

"खै, मलाई के थाहा ? तपाईं नै भन्नुहोस् न तपाईंको कुरा ।" उनी भावुक भएर बोलिन् ।

मैले धेरैबेर नै उनको उत्तर दिन सिकन । आफ्नो तरङ्गमा हराइरहें । मेरो कङ्गोको यात्राको वास्तविकता अर्के थियो । तर जहाँ वास्तविकता खुलाउँदा मान्छेहरू अनौठो मान्थे । त्यसैले मैले वास्तविकता खुलाउने गरेको थिइन ।

"कङ्गोको संयुक्त राष्ट्र संघ (UNO) को अफिसमा थुप्रै नेपालीहरू काम गर्दछन्। तिनीहरूको काम कस्तो भइरहेको छ, कङ्गोलीहरू नेपालीहरूको कामबाट कित्तको सन्तुष्ट छन्, त्यही बुभन्न आएको हुँ।" मैले आफुलाई आफैँले उल्लू बनाएँ।

"यो कुरो भने सत्य लाग्यो। कङ्गोमा थुप्रै नेपालीहरू काम गर्छन्।" उनले मितर आँखा लगाउँदै फेरि बोलिन्-"नेपालीहरूको काम-कारबाही, गराई बुभ्गनुभयो त? कस्तो लाग्यो? कङ्गोलीहरू सन्तुष्ट छन् त नेपालीहरूबाट?"

"जुन कुरा म भुठो बोलिरहेको छु, त्यही कुरो तिमीलाई सत्य लाग्यो ? म कहाँ युएनओको कर्मचारी हुनु ! केको नेपालीहरूको बारेमा बुभ्ग्न आउनु ?"

"िकन आउनुभएको हो त ?" उनी खिस्स हाँस्दै फीर सोधिन् । हावा कुरा गरेर भए पिन ती महिलालाई थमाउनु थियो । आखिर मेरो सबै अध्योपान्त उनलाई सुनाउनु जरुरी पिन थिएन । "म यहाँ व्यापार गर्न आएको हुँ । कङ्गोमा व्यापार निकै राम्रो हुन्छ भन्ने सुनेको थिएँ । के यहाँ व्यापार राम्रो हुन्छ ?"

"व्यापार !" उनको अनुहार उज्यालो भयो- "तपाईं व्यापार गर्न पो आउन्भएको ? साँच्ची ?"

उनी आफू बसेको ठाउँबाट जुरुक्क उठिन्।

हामीबीच व्यापारसम्बन्धी राम्रा-राम्रा बहस भए। हामीहरूले निकै छलफल गऱ्यौं। एकैछिनमा उनले मेरो कम्पनीमा जागिर खाइसकेकी थिइन् भने म कम्पनीको मालिक भइसकेको थिएँ। ती महिलाले व्यापारको नाफाबाट स्वर्णिम आनन्द लिइसकेकी थिइन्। उनको जाँगर र उत्साह निकै जुरमुराइसकेको थियो। तर मलाई मेरो आफनै हावादारी कुराले पोलिरहेको थियो। भित्रभित्र डामिरहेको थियो।

त्यसको भोलिपल्ट अघिल्लो दिनभन्दा अभ फूर्तिलो हुँदै देखा परिन् ती महिला । उनी मेरो निजकै आइन् र एउटा कागजको टुक्रो हातमा थमाउँदै बोलिन्-"सर, किन्सासामा अरु नेपाली व्यापारी पनि छन् । त्यो नम्बरमा फोन गरेर पत्ता लगाउनुहोस् त ! तपाईंले चिनेका व्यक्ति पनि हुन सक्छन् । तपाईंलाई व्यापार गर्न सजिलो हन्छ ।"

मलाई फोन गर्ने आँट आएन । के हिसाबले फोन गर्न् । के हिसाबले सम्पर्क बढाउन् । म त्यो क्षेत्रको व्यक्ति नै थिइनँ । म व्यापारको लागि आएको थिइनँ । तर मैले ती महिलाले दिएको कागजको टुक्रामा आँखा लगाएँ । कागजमा लेखिएको थियो- विजय अनि उसको फोन नम्बर ।

तत्काल फोर ती महिलातिर हेरें । उनको अनुहार उल्लासले धपक्क बलेको थियो । उनी फोनको प्रतीक्षामा थिइन् । तर मैले कागजको टुका बटारें र गोजीतिर राख्दै उनीतिर हेरेर बोलें-"पछि सम्पर्क गरौंला । अहिले हतार गर्दा भन् काम बिग्रन सक्छ ।" मेरो कुरा सुनेपछि उनको अनुहार खिन्न देखियो । हाम्रो भेट हुने क्रम बढ्दै गयो । उनी जालो बनाउँदै गफलाई लम्बाइरहेकी थिइन् । आफूलाई सौभाग्यशाली ठानिरहेकी थिइन् । तर मैले भने हावादारी गफमा भुलाइरहेको थिएँ । कामै नपरी महिला-पुरुष बीचको गफ लम्बिनु भनेको समाजको विश्वास गुमाउनु हो । त्योबारेमा उनलाई पिन थाहा थियो । म भन् सचेत थिएँ । तर उनलाई जागिरको

आशाले विवश बनाएको थियो भने त्यो विवशतामा म पनि थिपएको थिएँ।

रेष्टुराँमा पस्ने हरेक व्यक्तिको पहिलो दृष्टि हामीहरूले नै सामना गरिरहेका हुन्थ्यौँ । प्रत्येक व्यक्तिले गर्ने आशााहरू आआफ्नै तहका हुन्छन् । महिलाले पुरुषबाट गर्ने आशा, गरिबले धनीबाट, जनताले राष्ट्रबाट गर्ने आशा । तर ती महिलाको आशा पृथक थियो । त्यो आशाका लागि उनले समाजका तिखा वचन सहेकी थिइन् । कडा नजर बेहोरिकी थिइन् । उनको एउटै आशा थियो – मलाई पसलको मालिक बनाउने अनि मेरो पसलमा जागिर खाने । वास्तवमा मान्छे आशाकै भरमा बाँचिरहेको हुँदो रहेछ । आशाकै भरमा जिइरहेको हुँदो रहेछ ।

श्रम गर्नु, पिसना बगउन्, आफनै पाखुरामा उभिन खोज्नु, कुनै गल्ती होइन । तर मैले उनलाई धेरै समय अन्धकारमा राख्नु उचित ठानिनँ । अन्धकारले विमोदन पैदा गर्छ, विमोदनबाट भ्रान्ती पैदा हुन्छ । त्यसैले मैले उनलाई खुलस्त पारिदिएँ-"हेर, म व्यापार गर्न आएको होइन । व्यापारसम्बन्धी कुनै ज्ञानै छैन मलाई । म विजयलाई चिन्दा पिन चिन्दिनँ । यी सबै कुरा आजबाट बिर्सिदेऊ ।"

"तपाई व्यापार गर्न नआएको भए पनि के भयो त! नेपालीको पसल रहेछ। मलाई त्यहाँ जागिर लगाइदिनुहोस् न!" उनले निक्कै आशाका साथ मलाई आग्रह गरिन्।

मलाई भन् ठूलो सङ्कट पऱ्यो। के निहुँले विजयलाई फोन गर्नु! कसरी सम्बन्ध गाँस्नु! तर पनि गहुङ्गो हुँदै उनले दिएको नम्बरमा फोन गरे। उताबाट महिलाको स्वर गुन्जियो, त्यसमा पनि फ्रेन्च भाषामा-"कसलाई खोज्नुभएको?"

मैले अङ्ग्रेजी उत्तर दिएँ-"म नेपालबाट आएको, विजयजीसँग क्रा गर्न सिकन्छ होला।"

उत्तिखेरै विजय बोले- "को बोल्नुभएको, कसलाई खोजन्भएको ? के काम छ ?"

अहो ! कस्तो हतार ! कस्तो व्यस्तता । कस्तो नमीठो लवज । बलै मैले आफ्नो परिचय दिएँ । तर परिचय दिँदादिँदै उनले बीचैमा मलाई रोके-"म अहिले हतारमा छु । पछि सम्पर्क गरौँला ।"

मैले कहिल्यै पनि शल्क लिएर नेपाली भाषा पढाउने वा सिकाउने गरेको छैन आजका दिन सम्म, भोली के हुन्छ थाहा छैन । अन्य क्रामा पक्के सहयोग छ नत्र कसरी यती लामो १२ बर्ष सम्म निरन्तर लागिरहन सक्यें र ? सबै भन्दा ठूलो सहयोग मेरो श्रीमान स्निल ढ्ंगेलको छ जसले शनिबार आइतवारको समयमा स्वयंसेबक भएर नेपाली भाषा पढाउन जांदा आजसम्मा एक पटक नजाउ भन्न भएको छैन । सधैं मलाई उत्साह र जांगर भरिदिने मेरा श्रीमानलाई यसै अन्तर्वाताको माध्यमबाट धन्यवाद दिन चाहन्छ । उंहाको साथै मेरा तिनै जना छोरा छोरी सुकृति, सुहानी र सुभमहरूको पनि सहयोग छ मलाई। क्रा ब्भिदिन्छन आमा ब्यस्त छे सधै भनेर । उनिहरूलाई सरसफाइ गरिदिने बेला, पार्कमा खेलाउन लाने बेला, बजार घुमाउन लाने बेलामा मैले नेपाली कक्षा जान् पर्छ भन्दा जान्न भन्दैनन् । कती पटक त नेपाली कक्षा भएकै बेलामा उनिहरूका साथीहरूको जन्मदिनको पाटी परेको हुन्छ तर उनिहरूलाई थाहा छ नेपाली कक्षा पछि मात्र वा अघी मात्र पार्टी जान पाइन्छ भनेर । त्यसमा उनिहरूले कहिल्यै भागडा गर्देनन् । मलाई अहिले एउटा क्राको याद आयो, मैले नेपाली भाषा पढाउन शुरु गर्दा सानी छोरी ३ वर्षकी थिई। छोरा सुभमलाई त मैले २ महिनाको हुँदा देखी कारिसटमा बोकेर नेपाली भाषा पढाउन जान्थें । पारिवारिक सहयोग यसरी प्राप्त भएको छ मलाई । यसको अलावा २००७ देखी २०११ सम्म नेब्रास्का नेपाली सोसाइटी र २०१२ देखी हालसम्म नेपाल सेन्टर अफ नर्थ क्यारोलिनाले नेपाली भाषा सिकाउने. पढाउने

एउटा नेपाली पाठशाला रुपी चौतारीको बन्दोबस्त गरिदिएको छ जुन चौतारीमा मलाई बिभिन्न गुरु तथा गुरुआमाहरूले सधैं मद्धत गर्नु हुन्छ पढाउनका लागि । तिनै गुरुआमाहरू मध्य कि एक तपाईं पनि हुनहुन्छ । सधैं साकारात्मक सोचले निरन्तरता दिने केही अभिभाबकहरू हुनहुन्छ उंहाहरूको शुभकामनाले पनि मलाई अघी बढ्न अप्रत्यक्ष रुपमा सहयोग भइरहेको छ ।

५. अमेरिकी ब्यस्त जीवनमा भाषा सिकाउन कसरी समय निकाल्नु हुन्छ ?

अरुको जस्तै ब्यस्त छ मेरो जीवन पिन । सोमवार देखी शुक्रवार सम्म विहान ८ वजेदेखी सांभ्र ४ वजेसम्म कार्यालयमै हुन्छु । सांभ्र ६ वजे देखी ९ वजे सम्मको समयमा छोरा छोरीलाई विभिन्न अतिरिक्त कृयाकलापका कक्षामा ल्याउदा लांदा, उनिहरूलाई खुवाइ पिलाई, गृहकार्य गराउदा गराउदै निन्द्राले छोपिसकेको हुन्छ । बाँकी रह्यो शनिवार र आईतवार त्यही २ दिनमा बांकी सम्पूर्ण सामाजिक कार्य लगायत आफ्नो घरको काम सिक्ष्याउनु पर्छ । सोही दिन अलिकती समय परिवारसँग सुटुक्क चोरेर नेपाली पढाउन जान्छु । भिनन्छ नि जहाँ इच्छा त्यंहा उपाय भनेर ।

६. तपाईंले पढाएका विचार्थिहरूसंग तपाई के आशा राष्ट्र हुन्छ ?

कक्षामा निरन्तर रुपमा आऊन । कहिले आउने कहिले नआउने नगरुन्। यत्ती द्ख्ख गरेर पढाएको बाल्वामा पानी हाले भौं खेर नजाओस् । नेपाली कक्षामा आएर मात्र पनि हंदैन कमसेकम घरमा पनि हप्तामा एकपटक आमा बाबा सँग बसेर पढ्न, गृहकार्य गरेर ल्याउन् जस्तो लाग्छ । नेपाली भाषा र संस्कृतिलाई पनि एउटा अभिन्न अंगको रुपमा लिउन, लेखुन, पढुन, एउटा असल नागरिक बन्न, आफ् बसेको समाज र नेपाली समाजलाई सधैं गरिमामय बनाउन् । नेपाली भाषालाई पनि आफ्नो उन्नतीको शिखर सम्म प्याउन् । अनी उनिहरूले त्यस्मा गर्ब गरुन र हामीलाई पनि गौरबान्वित तुल्याउन् । त्यती गर्दा गर्दै पुन: नेपाली भाषा अर्को पिंढिमा सार्ने बेला भईसक्छ । अहिले मैले सिकाए भौं मेरा विद्यार्थिले पनि भोली नयाँ आउने पिंढिलाई नेपाली भाषा सिकाउंदै जाउन । नेपाली भाषालाई बिदेशमै (अमेरिकामै) बसे पनि अजम्बरी बनाइरहुन।

मेरी विद्यार्थी आयुश्मा शर्मा जो अहिले शिक्षिका भएर अरुसंगै साना भाइबैनीहरूलाइ नेपाली पढाइरहेकी छन्। मैले सोधेका प्रश्नहरूलाइ उनले यसरी उत्तर दिएकी छन: 1. Why do you like Nepalese language?

I do not just like the Nepalese language, I love it. A very wise man named Edmund de Wall once said "With languages, you are at home anywhere." Growing up thousands of miles away from my motherland, our Nepalese language was the most important way that I preserved the cultures and values of home. It was the first language that I learned to speak while growing up, and I cherish everything that I have gained from the language. Growing up in America, we are bound to learn English. However, I have learned that while one language may set us in a corridor for life, a second language will open every door along the way. Our Nepalese language has done that for me, and that is why I love it the most.

2. Do you have any interesting things to remember when you were learning Nepalese language at

the very beginning?

My family and I migrated to the U.S. when I was three years old, so I was already able to speak Nepalese. I remember beginning to learn English, and being very confused on which language to use at which setting. In order to assure that I would never forget our language, my family and I made a rule that once we are inside of the house, we can never speak in English. Because of that rule I can still speak Nepalese very fluently. The hard part came when I began learning how to read and write Nepalese. I first began going to Nepalese school in Omaha, Nebraska. While attending there, Sujata aunty was my teacher, and I learned a lot of my writing from there. I remember at the beginning, having a lot of trouble remembering all of the alphabet. I would learn the first few lines, master them, and move on to the last few lines, and by the time I had learned the last few lines, the first few would once again become confusing. While writing, I also remember frequently writing letters backwards. Especially 'Ba' and 'Wuh'. I learned that it's a process, and only a lot of practice can help you get better. Reading Nepalese was the same way. At first, I was very -very slow, but with practice, I gradually

got better.
3. There are plenty of areas to do volunteering, but how did you motivate to teach Nepalese language?

While it is true that there are many different areas where I can volunteer, not everyone has the opportunity to volunteer at a Nepalese school, teaching a language that I am so proud to speak. I grew up going to Nepalese school, and I remember always looking up to the 'uncles' and 'auntys', 'dais' and 'didis' wishing I could teach the same way that they taught me. So after I graduated Nepalese school in 2015, I was ecstatic to finally have the opportunity to pass on the knowledge that I have learned to others. Nepalese school has not only given me that opportunity, but it is also a great way for me to refresh my memory, and ensure that I never forget how to read and write as well. As I always say, practice makes perfect! On top of that, I love being around little kids, and teaching at Nepalese school means I get to be around them all the time. Not only am I able to teach little kids how to read and write Nepalese, but I also have the opportunity to teach dance there. As many people know, I am a huge dance enthusiast, so I really enjoy being able to teach the kids. I am motivated to teach Nepalese language at Nepalese school because it is the perfect platform for me to do all the things I love. I consider myself very lucky to have that opportunity. 4. You are a high school student, isn't it hard to balance both Nepalese and English language? Because I have been speaking both languages for so long, I think I have found a good balance between the two, but I remember it being very difficult when I was a kid. I remember going to the park and talking to kids in Nepalese, and then later crying because they could not understand what I was saying. The same used to occasionally happen at school. At home, although I tried my very best to not speak English, I remember occasionally having to speak it to get my point across. It's hard when you are a little kid trying to balance both languages at once. But after a while, it became a lot easier. The same happens with balancing the Nepalese and American culture. We are expected to follow both cultural norms, but for people of any age, that can be difficult to adjust to. Now, as a high school student, I think I have found a balance between the two. By no means is the balance perfect, but it has been working well for me.

गैर आवासीय नेपाली संघ (एन आर एन ए) र प्रवासिएका हामीहरू

पछिल्लो समय विश्वव्यापीकरणसँगै नेपालीहरू पनि संसारका विभिन्न देशहरूमा प्गेका छन् । रोजगारी, अध्ययन र अन्य सिलसिलामा फन्डै ५० लाख भन्दा बढी संख्यामा नेपाली नेपाल बाहिर रहेको अन्मान गरिन्छ । अमेरिका, क्यानडा, अष्ट्रेलिया, बेलायत आदि देशहरूमा त नेपालीहरूले स्थायी बसोबास समेत थालेको पाइन्छ । भूगोलको जुन कुनामा पुगे पनि हामी नेपालीहरू भावनामा नेपाली नै भएर रम्न चाहन्छौं। यसैले हामी जहाँ जहाँ रहेपनि औपचारिक या अनौपचारिक रुपमा संगठित भएर रहने गरेका छौँ। हामी बस्ने सहरहरूमा नेपाली मुलका सामुदायिक संस्थाहरू खुलेका छन्, तिनले नेपाली विभिन्न सामाजिक, सांस्कृतिक कार्यक्रमहरू गर्दै आएका छन । यसका अतिरिक्त विभिन्न पेशा र चाहनाका आधारमा पनि प्रवासमा थुप्रै संघसंस्थाहरू खुलेका छन् । यी सबै खाले संघसंस्था भन्दा फरक र बृहत उद्देश्यका साथ नेपाल बाहिर बस्ने सबै नेपालीको साभा र छाता संगठनको रुपमा काम गर्ने संस्थाको खाँचो महसस गरी सन् २००३ मा गैर आवासीय नेपाली संघ (एन.आर.एन.ए) को स्थापना गरिएको छ । १६ भन्दा बढी देशबाट १ सय ६० जनाभन्दा बढी नेपालीहरूको उपस्थितिमा ११ अक्टोबर २००३ मा काठमाडौंमा पहिलो पटक विश्व सम्मेलनको आयोजना गरी विधिवत रुपमा यो संगठनको स्थापना गरिएको हो। क्नै पार्टी निरपेक्ष, क्नै धर्म, क्षेत्र र जाति निरपेक्ष होस्, जहाँ विदेशिएका सबै नेपाली अटाउन सक्न भनेर स्थापित यो संस्थाले आफ्नो स्थापनाकाल देखि नै विदेशमा बसेका नेपालीहरूबीच भाइचाराको वद्धि गर्ने, विदेशमा नेपाली भाषा र संस्कृतिको जगेर्ना गर्ने र विदेशमा कमाएको धन र ज्ञानबाट नेपालको समृद्धिमा टेवा प्ऱ्याउने उद्देश्य राखेको छ । गैर आवासीय नेपाली संघ (एन.आर.एन.ए) अहिले विश्वको ७८ मुलुकमा स्थापना भएको छ । गत वर्ष काठमाडौंमा सम्पन्न आठौँ विश्व सम्मेलनसम्म आइप्ग्दासम्म करिब ७० हजारभन्दा बढी पञ्जिकत सदस्य छन्।

नेपाल सरकारको परिभाषा अनुसार २ वर्षभन्दा बढी बाहिर बस्ने नेपालीहरू गैर आवासीय नेपाली हुन् । पञ्जिकृत सदस्य संख्याको आधारमा संयुक्त राज्य अमेरिकाको गैर आवासीय नेपाली संघ राष्ट्रिय समन्वय समिति सबैभन्दा ठूलो मानिन्छ । हालसम्म एन.आर.एन अमेरिकामा सत्र हजार भन्दा बढी पञ्जिकृत सदस्य छन् भने चौबिस राज्यहरूमा च्याप्टरहरू खुलेका छन्। यी मध्ये नर्थ क्यारोलाइना च्याप्टर पनि एक सिक्रय च्याप्टरको रुपमा क्रियाशिल छ। पहिलो पटक सन् २०१५ मा स्थापित नर्थ क्यारोलाइना च्याप्टरको हाल दोस्रो कार्यकाल हो। हाल नर्थ क्यारोलाइनाबाट करिब चार सय जना पिञ्जकृत सदस्य छन् भने विभिन्न शहरको प्रतिनिधित्व गर्दै ११ सदस्यीय कार्यसमिति छ। नर्थ क्यारोलाइना च्याप्टरले आफ्नो स्थापना कालदेखि नै स्थानीय संघ संस्थाहरूसँगको सहकार्यमा नेपाली समुदायको हितका लागि कार्यक्रमहरू गर्दै आएको छ। गैर आवासीय नेपाली संघले गर्ने कार्यक्रमहरूमा स्थानीय च्याप्टर, राष्ट्रिय समन्वय समिति र अन्तर्राष्ट्रिय समन्वय समितिको आ-आफ्नै दायरा छन्। यद्यपि यी कार्यक्रमहरूलाई मुख्य रुपमा तीन भागमा वर्गीकरण गर्न सिकन्छ।

गैर आवासीय नेपालीको हक हित

गैर आवासीय नेपाली संघ मलतः गैर आवासीय नेपालीहरूद्वारा स्थापित संस्था हुनाले यस संस्थाले गर्ने कार्यक्रमहरू देशभित्र या बाहिर गैर आवासीय नेपालीहरूकै हक हित संरक्षण र प्रबर्द्धन गर्नमै केन्द्रित छन । देशभित्र गैरआवासीय नेपालीहरूकै हक हित संरक्षण गर्नको लागि एनआरएनले "एकपटकको नेपाली सदाको नेपाली" भन्ने नारालाई आफुनो स्थापनाकाल देखि नै जोडतोडका साथ उठाएको छ । फलस्वरुप संघिय नेपालको नयाँ संविधानको धारा १४ मा "विदेशी मुलुकको नागरिकता प्राप्त गरेको दक्षिण एसियाली सहयोग संगठनका सदस्य राष्ट्र बाहेकका देशमा बसोबास गरेको साविकमा वंशजको जन्मको आधारमा निज वा निजको ब्बा वा आमा, बाजे वा बजै, नेपालको नागरिक रही पछि विदेशी मुलुकको नागरिकता प्राप्त गरेको व्यक्तिलाई नागरिकता प्रदान गर्न सिकनेछ" भन्ने व्यवस्था गरेर दोहोरो नागरिकताको सिद्धान्तलाई स्वीकार गरेको छ । यो संवैधानिक व्यवस्था अन्सार विदेशमा रहेर विदेशी नागरिकता प्राप्त गरेकाहरूले राजनीतिक बाहेक अरु अधिकारहरू प्रयोग गर्न पाउने गरी गैर आवासीय नेपाली नागरिकता प्राप्त गर्न सक्नेछन । यद्यपि यसलाई रुपान्तरण गर्नका लागि नीतिनियम बन्न बाँकी छन । यसमा एन.आर.एन.को भूमिका अभौ बाँकी छ। एन.आर.एन.ए को पहलमा नेपाल सरकारले नेपाली

मुलुकका विदेशी नागरिक वा विदेशमा बस्ने नेपालीका

लागि छुट्टै गैर आवासीय नेपाली परिचय पत्रको व्यवस्था गरेको छ । गैर आवासीय नेपाली सम्बन्धी ऐन २०६४ र नियमावली, २०६६ मा व्यवस्था भए अनुसार कागजात सिंहत निवेदन दिएर विदेश स्थित नेपाली दुतावासबाट वा नेपालको परराष्ट्र मन्त्रालयबाट उक्त परिचयपत्र लिन सिंकने व्यवस्था छ ।

विदेशमा रहेका नेपालीहरूलाई सम्बन्धित देशहरूमा "भिजिवल माइनोरिटी" को रुपमा स्थापित गर्न पहल गर्नु, विदेशमा रहेका नेपालीहरूको सुख दु:खमा साथ दिन्, उनीहरूको वृद्धिविकासमा सघाउनु एन आर एनको अर्को महत्वपूर्ण कार्य हो । नेपालीहरूलाई "भिजिवल माइनोरिटी" को रुपमा स्थापित गर्नु एक रणनैतिक सवाल हो । यसका लागि एन आर एनले विभिन्न संघसंस्थाहरूसँग मिलेर नेपाली पहिचान देखाउने काम गर्दे आएको छ ।

विदेशमा रहेका नेपालीहरूलाई पर्ने गरेका र पर्न सक्ने आपतकालिन र अन्य समस्याहरूसँग जुध्नको लागि एन आर एनले "हेल्प डेस्क" को अवधारणा सुरु गरेको छ । स्थानीय च्याप्टरहरू र अन्य सामुदायिक संस्थाहरूसँगको सहकार्यमा शुरु गरिएको हेल्प डेस्क कार्यक्रम एन आर एन अमेरिकाको महत्वपूर्ण कार्यक्रम हो । विगतदेखि नै गर्दै आएको आपतकालिन सहयोगलाई यो कार्यक्रमले अभ संस्थागत गराउने विश्वास गरिएको छ । यो कार्यक्रमबाट भविष्यमा अमेरिका निवासी नेपाली समुदायले राम्रै "सेफ्टी नेट" को महसुस गर्ने अपेक्षा गरिएको छ ।

एन आर एनले बेला बेलामा युवा र महिला केन्द्रित कार्यक्रमहरू पिन गर्दै आएको छ । यी कार्यक्रमहरूले समुदायको जनचेतना अभिवृद्धि गरे र क्षमता विकासमा समेत टेवा पुगेको छ । अन्तर्राष्ट्रिय महिला दिवसको सन्दर्भमा आयोजना गर्ने गरेको कार्यक्रमहरूले फरक सांस्कृतिक सन्दर्भमा महिला अधिकार, महिला हिंसा र सशक्तिकरणलाई बुभ्न टेवा पुऱ्याएको छ । युवा छात्रवृत्ति कार्यक्रमले युवा पुस्ताको समुदायप्रति लगाव र नेतृत्व विकासमा टेवा पुगेको छ । एन आर एनले गरेका कार्यहरू गैर आवासीय नेपालीहरूको हक हित संरक्षणका लागि सहानीय भए पिन उनीहरूको वृद्धि विकासको लागि गर्नुपर्ने र गर्न सक्ने थुप्रै काम बाँकी नै छन ।

विदेशमा आर्जित ज्ञान, सीप र धन मातृभूमिको विकास र समृद्धिमा लगाउन् एन आर एनको अर्को महत्वपूर्ण उद्देश्य हो । यसका लागि एन आर एनले नेपाल सरकारसँग नीतिगत तहमा सहकार्य गर्दै आएको छ। यसबाट नेपालमा लगानी र सहयोगको वातावरण बन्दै आएको छ । एन आर एनले सरकार र सरकारबीच मात्र नभई सरकार र जनताबीच पुल बनेर विदेशी लगानी सीप भित्राउन सिकने सम्भावना देखेको छ । व्यापार प्रबद्धेन, आयोजनाहरूमा लगानी, नेपालमा विपदको बेला सहयोग, खुल्ला विश्वविद्यालय स्थापना आदि एन आर एनले नेपालको विकास र समृद्धिको लागि गर्दै आएका केही महत्वपूर्ण कार्यहरू हुन्। नेपालमा भुकम्पले तहसनहस पादो होस् या बाढी पहिरो र आगलागीले विपत्ति आइलाग्दा एन आर एनले स्वतस्फूर्त रुपमा तत्कालिन राहत र पुनर्निमाणमा सहयोग गरेको छ । भूकम्प पछि पुनर्निर्माण हुँदै गरेको लाप्राक नमुना बस्ती एन आर एनको उदाहरणीय कार्य हो । काठमाडौंमा निर्माणाधीन शंखमुल बर्गेचा एन आर एनको अको सहानीय कार्य हो । काठमाडोंको त्रिभ्वन विमानस्थल सरसफाई कार्यक्रम एन आर एनको पहलमा भएको सानो तर प्रभावकारी कार्यक्रम हो । भर्खरै अमेरिकाको सानफ्रान्सिस्कोमा एन आर एनले पहिलोपटक करिब ३ सय जित विभिन्न विषयका विशेषज्ञ सहितको विज्ञ सम्मेलन सम्पन्न गरेको छ । यसले नेपालको समद्धि र विकासमा नेपाली डायस्पोराको भूमिकालाई अभ्र बृहत बनाएको छ। एन आर एनले विदेशीएका नेपालीहरू विदेशका गगन च्म्बकीय भवन बनाउने मात्रै हैन आफनै देश बनाउन पनि बलियो सहकार्य गर्न सक्छन उनीहरू संसारभरीबाट विकासका साभोदार बन्न सक्छन् भन्ने सन्देश दिएको छ।
