The third and most recent NCNC Teen Council meeting was on Leadership and Personal Branding. The beginning session was conducted by guest speaker Hayman Linn Lae Zaw, the head of youth management at NCAAT. NCAAT (North Carolina Asian Americans Together) is a program to is aimed to build a more inclusive democracy by using the strength of community unity, diverse traditions, and customary values. Hayman presented the principal goal of NCAAT to begin this meeting, then; she shared what the youth community could do to help. NCAAT gives youth and adolescents from high school to college to volunteer and engage in this cause. Volunteering and internship opportunities fall under their youth programs. These opportunities offer teens to develop different community outreaches ranging from advocacy, cultural education, and "civic engagement to public policy".
